Honorable Chair Larson and Members of the Senate Judiciary Committee,

I urge you to oppose SB 2307. This bill would unfairly criminalize librarians for doing their jobs and represents a dangerous overreach into parental rights and intellectual freedom.

Librarians are highly trained professionals who carefully curate collections to ensure age-appropriate materials are placed in the correct sections. They uphold community standards while fostering literacy, critical thinking, and a love of learning. This bill is rooted in misinformation and would punish those who serve our communities by making them liable for materials that undergo rigorous review.
