I strongly oppose SB 2307 - unconstitutional censorship and criminalization of librarians...

Local communities to decide: Our local library boards represent the local community, and they are in the best position to communicate with the local librarian

If the local citizens have a concern about certain materials in the library--and together, those at the local level can deal with the issue in the best way for that community.

Waste of money and time: These attacks on public and school libraries are a massive waste of time and tax payer money

Two years ago a similar law was passed.

Libraries complied.
