ND Higher Education Challenge Grant

Senate Appropriations – Education and Environment Division January 21, 2025

Background

- The 63rd Legislative Assembly initiated this program to enhance North Dakota University System institutions through a matching grant fund.
- One dollar in matching grants for every two dollars of nonstate, non-federal dollars raised by the institutional foundations of North Dakota public colleges and universities for projects dedicated to the advancement of academics.
- Distributions of grant awards are made based upon the review and approval of the legislatively prescribed grant review committee.
 - Grant review committee consists of:
 - the Governor, or the Governor's designee, who serves as the chairman of the committee;
 - two members of the House of Representatives Appropriations Committee;
 - two members of the Senate Appropriations Committee;
 - two members appointed by the Governor; and
 - two members appointed by the State Board of Higher Education.



N.D.C.C. 15-10-48 through 15-10-53

- N.D.C.C. 15-10-48 establishes expectations for advancement of academics utilizing the challenge grant for the research universities (UND and NDSU)
- N.D.C.C. 15-10-48.2 (New in 2023) establishes expectations for challenge grant funding for the NDSU Agriculture Research and Extension at the agricultural experiment station.
- N.D.C.C. 15-10-49 establishes expectations for advancement of academics utilizing the challenge grant for two-year and four-year institutions of higher education
- N.D.C.C. 15-10-50 establishes foundation liability for pledge amounts
- N.D.C.C. 15-10-51 establishes the challenge grant review committee
- N.D.C.C. 15-10-52 establishes the challenge grant review committee compensation
- N.D.C.C. 15-10-53 defines challenge grant projects are to be dedicated to the advancement of enhanced academics include investments in research, scholarships, technology, endowed chairs, and investments in educational infrastructure, but exclude scholarships intended solely for the benefit of athletics, campus facility repair projects, and new capital construction projects.

- 63rd Legislative Assembly approved \$29,000,000 (HB 1204 & SB 2003)
- 64th Legislative Assembly approved \$23,500,000 (HB 1151)
 2016 Allotment reduced by \$1,375,500 to total of \$22,124,500
- 65th Legislative Assembly approved \$2,000,000 (SB 2003)
- 66th Legislative Assembly approved \$9,650,000 (HB 1003)
 School of Law included for first time at \$250,000
- 67th Legislative Assembly approved \$11,150,000 (SB 2030)
 - UND School of Medicine and Health Sciences included for first time at \$1,500,000
- 68th Legislative Assembly approved \$20,000,000 (HB 1003)
 - NDSU Agriculture Research and Extension included for first time at \$2,200,000
 - Repealed UND School of Law N.D.C.C. 15-10-48.1
 - Added further definition for pooled funding to N.D.C.C. 15-10-49

Endowed vs. Non-Endowed Scholarships

- Since the program's inception in 2013, \$53.6 million in state funds were dedicated to scholarships and matched with nearly \$110 million in private donations.
 - \$163.6 million scholarship investment
 - Approximately 90% in endowed scholarships
 - Approximately 10% in regular scholarships
