# Capital Budget Requests

### Dakota Hall Demolition – \$635,000

- Received \$765,000 during the 2023 Session for the demolition of Dakota Hall
- Asbestos abatement has been completed in preparation for demolition
- Architect has been hired to oversee demolition
  - **Discovered an issue with utility tunnels under the building** that feed utilities to three other campus buildings
  - Additional funds are needed to preserve and secure the tunnels after demolition and ensure any future development of the Dakota Hall footprint is not restricted

#### Academic Facilities Renovation - \$8,132,000

- Authorized in the 2023 Session in HB 1003 with legislative intent to be appropriated in the 2025 Session
- To support **renovations of academic facilities in growing/high-demand areas such as Nursing, Exercise** Science & Rehabilitation, Computer Science, Cybersecurity, and the Sciences; no new square footage

#### Regional Health Sciences Institute - \$12,350,000

- Joint request from MiSU and DCB; rated by the SBHE as a top priority among all NDUS capital requests
- Purchase the Trinity Health Center West facility in downtown Minot
- MiSU and DCB collaborate to **share a simulation center and Nursing programming** including 1-, 2-, and 4-yr (and perhaps) Master's in one facility, **along with many other health-related programs** through DCB
- Fills an important need for **delivering education in critical health-related areas that can have a major impact on workforce shortages** in central and western North Dakota

### Student Center 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor Renovation – Authority for Spending and Selling Revenue Bonds

- MiSU received spending authority in the 2023 Session for the project, but approval to sell revenue bonds to finance the project was missed
- Requesting carryover of the \$3.1 Million spending authority and authorization to sell revenue bonds

## Support Systemwide Projects/Initiatives

- Increased Challenge Grant funding; Support Governor Armstrong's \$50M recommendation
- Increased Capital Building Funds (Tier II/III) to address deferred maintenance
- Strongly support the \$24M Workforce Education Innovation Program (HB 1221)
- Expand EDRF for both the research institutions and the nine primarily undergraduate institutions (PUIs)
- Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) Cloud Readiness for PeopleSoft Replacement
- Expand Nursing Education Consortium
- NDPERS Actuarially Determined Employer Contribution (ADEC)
- Financial Aid Enhancement/Title IV Course Auditor
- Expanding North Dakota State Grant and Dual Credit Scholarship
