In this role, I witness the immense value that NDSU Extension programs and Soil Conservation Districts (SCDs) bring to communities across North Dakota. The funds allocated to the SSCC through SB 2020 are a lifeline for SCDs across the state. - Seeded more than 2,800 acres of cover crops and over 4,000 acres of grasslands, enhancing soil health, livestock forage, and wildlife habitats.
- Installed more than 600 miles of weed barriers and planting nearly 37,000 trees by hand, contributing to erosion control and ecological stability.
- Hosted workshops, programs, and field days that engaged over 5,400 participants, promoting sustainable agricultural practices.
- Conducted more than 250 hours of soil testing and over 350 hours of soil mapping to empower agricultural producers with actionable insights.
- Provided 335 field visits and dedicated more than 3,100 hours to delivering conservation technical assistance directly to producers.

These achievements are just a snapshot of the critical work SCDs accomplish to preserve our state's most valuable natural resources: our soil and water. With your support for an enhanced operating budget, SCDs can expand these impactful programs and address the growing conservation needs of our state.
