I write today to urge you to oppose any legislation that promotes ESAs, vouchers, or "school choice".

These are plans that will take money that could (and should) otherwise be used to improve our public schools for all students. ESAs and vouchers would take taxpayer money and give it to families who choose to send their kids to schools that can (and do) deny students admission, they take money from the rural taxpayer and redistribute it to areas where private schools are located, and they duplicate services that already exist in many of our communities.
