**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
FIRST ENGROSSMENT**

**ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1442**

1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-35 of the North Dakota  
2 Century Code, relating to the creation of a legislative task force on government efficiency; to  
3 provide an expiration date; and to declare an emergency.

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 54-35 of the North Dakota Century Code is created  
6 and enacted as follows:

7 **Legislative task force on government efficiency - Members - Duties - Report to the**  
8 **legislative management.**

9 1. The legislative management shall create a legislative task force on government  
10 efficiency.

11 2. Each member of the task force shall serve two-year terms. The membership of the  
12 task force consists of:

13 a. ~~The chief information officer;~~

14 ~~b. The director of the office of management and budget;~~

15 e.b. The chief operating officer for the office of the governor;

17 c. Two elected statewide officerofficers, appointed by the governor;

18 ~~e. One member of the legislative assembly, appointed by the governor;~~

- 1 d. Three members of the house of representatives, appointed by the majority leader  
2 of the house of representatives; and

- 4 e. Three members of the senate, appointed by the majority leader of the senate.
- 5 3. ~~The member of the legislative assembly appointed by the governor~~chairman of the  
6 legislative management shall select a member of the legislative assembly appointed  
7 under subdivision d or e of subsection 2 to serve as chairman of the task force.
- 8 4. The task force shall:
- 9 a. Meet at least once each calendar quarter or more frequently at the call of the  
10 chairman.
- 11 b. Review and analyze budgets and reports from executive branch agencies,  
12 boards and commissions, and the supreme court.
- 13 c. Collaborate with and receive testimony from executive branch agencies, boards  
14 and commissions, and the supreme court to identify areas to increase efficiency,  
15 methods to implement cost-saving measures, determine areas of state  
16 government deemed unnecessary or duplicative, target outdated or overly  
17 restrictive regulations, and find areas in which partnerships between the state  
18 and private industry would create innovative financing models to drive economic  
19 growth and job creation.
- 20 d. Review the effectiveness and necessity of programs and laws created by the  
21 legislative assembly through previous legislative enactments.
- 22 e. Request the state auditor or an independent private auditing firm to conduct  
23 program evaluations using generally accepted performance audit standards for  
24 state and local governments.
- 25 f. Submit an annual report to the legislative management detailing its findings and  
26 progress in implementing cost-saving measures and efficiencies along with any  
27 recommended legislation for introduction at the next legislative session.
- 28 5. A state employee who is a member of the task force is entitled to receive that  
29 employee's regular salary and is entitled to reimbursement for mileage and expenses  
30 to be paid by the employing agency. A member of the task force who is a member of  
31 the legislative assembly is entitled to receive per diem compensation at the rate

1           provided under section 54-35-10 for each day performing official duties of the task  
2           force. The legislative council shall pay the per diem compensation and reimbursement  
3           for travel and expenses as provided by law for any member of the task force who is a  
4           member of the legislative assembly.

5           6. The legislative council shall provide staffing and administrative services for the task  
6           force through July 31, 2031.

7           **SECTION 2. EXPIRATION DATE.** This Act is effective through July 31, 2031, and after that  
8           date is ineffective.

9           **SECTION 3. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
