- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 54 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to a state alert notice system; and to repeal sections 39-03-13.2 and 54-12-32 of
- 3 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the state's silver and blue alert notice systems.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 SECTION 1. A new chapter to title 54 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and 6 enacted as follows:
- 7 **Definitions.**

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- 8 As used in this chapter:
  - 1. "Amber alert notice" means an urgent bulletin using the emergency alert system to air a description of a child who has been abducted.
  - 2. "Blue alert notice" means an urgent bulletin using the emergency alert system to air a description of an individual or an individual's vehicle to aid in the apprehension of an individual who has threatened a law enforcement officer with a deadly weapon, used a deadly weapon against a law enforcement officer, caused a law enforcement officer to suffer serious bodily injury or death, abducted a law enforcement officer, or caused a law enforcement officer to go missing while on duty, and the individual has left the scene of the offense.
  - 3.4. "Silver alert notice" means an urgent bulletin using the emergency alert system to air a description of a missing individual to aid in the location of that individual.

  - a. An endangered disabled adult or elderly vulnerable adult as defined in section
    50-25.2-01 who has disappeared and whose disappearance has been reported to law enforcement;

23				sufficient evidence that the particular circumstances or duration warrant a
24				silver alert notice activation.
