Intent of this bill...

- Provide lasting recognition and appreciation to the North Dakota Service Men and Women who have died for our Country in time of war.
- Lieutenant Commander Carl Julius Woods died on September 28, 1965, while flying an armed reconnaissance mission near Qui Vinh, North Vietnam aboard CVA-31 off the USS Bon Homme Richard, Attack Squadron, Carrier Air Wing 19, of the 7th Fleet. His A-1H was hit by anti-aircraft artillery. Woods flew the burning aircraft 40 miles to the Tonkin Gulf, where he bailed out. A Search and Rescue (SAR) helo arrived quickly, but Lieutenant Commander Woods was already dead. He received the Purple Heart.
 - Lieutenant Commander Woods is honored on Panel 02e, Line 97 of the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial in Washington, DC.
 - Resident of Bottineau.
 - Left behind by his wife Elaine, son Mark and daughters Jennifer and Kathryn.
 - Interred: Arlington National Cemetery VA
