AERIAL SPRAYING LICENSE

AN ACT

Relating to licensing of aircraft used in aerial spraying and regulations pertaining thereto, and providing a penalty, and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

§ 1. License For Aerial Spraying; Regulations; Penalties.)

No person shall engage in aerial spraying without first obtaining a license for each aircraft used in such activities as provided in this section. Application shall be made for such license to the North Dakota aeronautics commission upon forms provided by the commission for such purpose. Upon the payment of a license fee of fifteen dollars for each aircraft to be licensed, and upon compliance with such reasonable rules and regulations as may be promulgated by the aeronautics commission for the safety and protection of persons and property, the commission shall issue a license for such aircraft to be used in aerial spraying. Persons engaged in private spraying shall be required to pay same fee for the use of aircraft for this purpose, and shall comply with all rules and regulations promulgated by the commission for aerial spraying. The license and fees provided in this section shall be in addition to any other license or registration required by law, one-half of the proceeds from such license fees shall be transferred to the state treasurer and credited to the general fund, the other half to the county treasurer to be divided equally to approved publicly owned or operated airfields in said county.

Any person violating any provision of this Act or rules or regulations promulgated under the authority of this Act shall be punished by a fine of not exceeding one hundred dollars or by imprisonment for not more than thirty days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

§ 2. Emergency.) This Act is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
