SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.) There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$231,800.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to carry out the provisions of subdivision 19 of this Act.

SECTION 3. EMERGENCY.) This Act is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

All Acts and parts of Acts that may be in conflict herewith are hereby repealed and if for any reason or cause any specific appropriation for any item or set of items should be held by the court or courts to be unconstitutional or illegal or otherwise unavailable for any cause, such holding shall not affect or be construed to apply to the remaining items of appropriation herein or purposes provided for herein.

SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION.) There is hereby appropriated to the governor's office any moneys received from federal sources for the purpose of continuation of the operations of the office of energy management within the governor's office during the biennium beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979.

SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT.) It is the intent of the legislative assembly that the state auditor, pursuant to the requirements of sections 54-10-13 and 54-10-14, shall charge an amount for the audit which will result in the state recovering a portion of all costs incurred, including supervisory, secretarial, clerical, and other office maintenance costs.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.) The sums hereinafter named only, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of the general fund and from special funds derived from federal funds and/or other income in the state treasury to the various departments and various divisions thereof of the state of North Dakota for the biennium beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979, for defraying expenses of the various departments and various divisions thereof of the state of North Dakota for purposes provided by law.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.) The moneys herein appropriated in accordance with budget categories for salaries and wages pertaining to workload change, different services, or added facilities shall be made available only after certification to the executive office of the budget that such changes, services, or facilities have been added, or that newly anticipated employees are actually in the employ of the state.

SECTION 3. INTENT, REPEAL, PURPOSE, AND CONSTRUCTION.) All Acts and parts of Acts that may be in conflict herewith are hereby repealed and if for any reason or cause any specific appropriation for any item or set of items should be held by the court or courts to be unconstitutional or illegal or otherwise unavailable for any cause, such holding shall not affect or be construed to apply to the remaining items of appropriation herein or purposes provided for herein.

SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT.) It is the intent of the legislature that the department of accounts and purchases review alternate methods of acquiring data processing equipment. In the event such alternate methods prove cost effective to the state of North Dakota, the department of accounts and purchases is hereby authorized to borrow moneys which are hereby appropriated from the Bank of North Dakota not to exceed three million dollars. It is further intended that before the department of accounts and purchases enter into any such agreements with the Bank of North Dakota, the legislative council committee on the budget must give prior approval for any loan or alternate method of acquiring data processing equipment.

* SECTION 5. CENTRAL DATA PROCESSING.) Expenditures pursuant to the appropriation, contained in subdivision 2 of this Act, to central data processing in the line items: "REAP - \$1,057,505"; and "Total general fund transfer and appropriation - \$1,057,505", shall be made only for such data processing services as may be requested by the resources research committee for REAP. Central data processing shall incur costs relating to REAP in amounts greater than such line items only to the extent that REAP pays for such services. A special limited application computer system shall be acquired by central data processing at the request of the resources research committee for use of REAP. The resources reasearch committee shall, prior to making a request for data processing services, review the proposals submitted by various vendors for the REAP computer system, the Arthur Andersen & Co. study of central data processing, the IBM system analysis and plan report for REAP, and any other computer studies that may have been completed for central data processing or REAP during the 1975-1977 biennium which relate to central data processing computer services for REAP. After the resources research committee has reviewed such reports and studies, it shall request data processing services, which may include a special limited application computer system, necessary for REAP to develop its systems prior to the next legislative assembly, and, upon a finding that any additional costs, which might arise because of such request, if such request includes a special limited application computer, are justified either on a basis of long-term projected cost savings or on the value and necessity of REAP services to the forty-sixth legislative assembly. The mainframe of such special limited application computer system shall be leased or purchased at the option of central data processing That computer system shall be retained by central data processing only until such time as central data processing has other equivalent computer and software applications and other equivalent data processing services which will meet REAP's operational needs without incurring greater total operating costs than REAP would incur by continuing to use the special limited application computer.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.) The sums hereinafter named only, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of the general fund and from special funds derived from federal funds and/or other income in the state treasury to the various departments and various divisions thereof of the state of North Dakota for the biennium beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979, for defraying expenses of the judicial departments of the state of North Dakota for purposes provided by law.

SECTION 2. TRANSFERS.) The director of accounts and purchases and the state treasurer shall make such transfer of funds between lined items of appropriation for the judicial branch of government as may be requested by the supreme court upon a finding by the court that the nature of the duties of the court and its staff require such transfers in properly carrying on the functions of the judicial branch of government.

SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE INTENT.) It is the intent of the legislative assembly that space for the operations of the supreme court be included in the state office building proposed in Senate Bill No. 2022 being considered by the forty-fifth legislative'assembly.

HOUSE BILL NO. 1004 (Committee on Appropriations)

PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX REPLACEMENT AND HOMESTEAD TAX CREDIT

AN ACT to provide an appropriation for the replacement of personal property taxes and homestead tax credit, and the distribution of such moneys.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.) There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$24,300,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the replacement of personal property taxes, in accordance with the formula for personal property tax replacement payments as provided for in section 57-58-01, during the biennium beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979. During the year ending June 30, 1978, such payment shall not exceed one-half of the total appropriation provided for in this Act.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.) There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$2,900,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the homestead tax credit, during the biennium beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979.

SECTION 3. CONTINGENT.) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 57-58-01, which contains the formula for personal property tax replacement payments, the payments shall not exceed the amounts as set forth in this Act. If the appropriation provided for in this Act in any fiscal year is less than the amount determined by applying the formula as contained in section 57-58-01, the director of the department of accounts and purchases shall pay only the amount of funds available under this Act. Under such circumstances, a method of proration shall be used that provides each eligible recipient the same proportion of these funds as the percent of total funds it would have received under the application of the formula provided for in section 57-58-01.

SECTION 6. INTENT.) It is the intent of the Legislative Assembly that payments for state aid to junior colleges be made in accordance with provisions of section 15-18-07 of the North Dakota Century Code relating to pro rata distribution of state aid to junior colleges and which states: "If the funds appropriated for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this section should prove to be insufficient based on the number of students in attendance at a junior college or educational center as provided in this section, the amounts to be paid to such junior colleges or educational center shall be reduced in such a manner so that the payments for each student in attendance at a junior college or educational center will be made on a pro rata basis.

SECTION 2. INTENT, REPEAL, PURPOSE, AND CONSTRUCTION.) All Acts and parts of Acts that may be in conflict herewith are hereby repealed and if for any reason or cause any specific appropriation for any item or set of items should be held by the court or courts to be unconstitutional or illegal or otherwise unavailable for any cause, such holding shall not affect or be construed to apply to the remaining items of appropriation herein or purposes provided for herein.

SECTION 3. PAYMENT OF UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION CLAIMS.) The department of accounts and purchases from the appropriation made in subdivision 16 of this Act shall guarterly reimburse the state unemployment compensation division for the amount of actual unemployment compensation claims paid by the unemployment compensation division to eligible recipients previously employed by state agencies and institutions. Beginning October 1, 1978, agencies, except for the institutions of higher education and the state hospital, with federal or other special funds available to pay unemployment compensation claims shall pay to the department of accounts and purchases one percent of the first six thousand dollars of each employee's earnings paid with federal or special funds. Beginning July 1, 1977, the state hospital and institutions of higher education with federal or other special funds available to pay unemployment compensation claims, shall pay to the department of accounts and purchases one percent of the first six thousand dollars of each employee's annual earnings. In addition, the institutions of higher education shall reimburse the department of accounts and purchases for any unemployment compensation claims paid, which were incurred prior to July 1, 1977, by persons previously employed and paid from federal or special funds.

SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION.) There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$250,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to the emergency commission for the purpose of providing funds for litigation costs related to the Garrison diversion project during the biennium beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979. The funds herein appropriated shall be

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transferred and spent by the attorney general only after the emergency commission has approved a request from his office for such funds for the purpose herein stated. That portion of section 54-16-01 which states "The aggregate total of transfers from the state contingency fund, within the limits of legislative appropriations, can exceed five hundred thousand dollars only to the extent that requests for transfers from the state contingency fund have been approved by the budget section of the legislative council."

SECTION 2. MATCHING FEDERAL FUNDS.) The state department of health may disburse all or any part of the moneys herein appropriated directly, and may use the money appropriated to match any federal funds available to local health units for such purposes.

SECTION 3. DISTRIBUTION.) Any county, municipal, or district health unit providing evidence to the state department of health of having an existing generalized service, or are able to institute a generalized service, including but not limited to services of a health officer, public health nursing, and environmental sanitation services shall be eligible to receive a basic payment of \$6,000.00 per county, plus \$.45 per capita for the biennium; however, no county, municipal, or district health unit shall be eligible for such payment unless it is contributing an amount for local health services equivalent to an amount that would be raised by the maximum mill levy authorized by section 23-14-11 for local health districts. SECTION 5. DEPARTMENT TO PROMULGATE RULES AND REGULATIONS.) The state health council is hereby empowered to promulgate rules and regulations and to determine the eligibility of the local health departments under this appropriation.

DISASTER GRANT PROGRAM REIMBURSEMENT

- AN ACT to provide funds to reimburse the federal government for the state's twenty-five percent share of three individual and family grant programs that were conducted in North Dakota following the spring flood of 1975, the severe storm and summer floods of 1975, and the spring flood of 1976.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. FUNDS.) The sum of \$76,821.97 is hereby appropriated to the division of disaster emergency services to close out the three individual and family grant programs that the division administered following the three major presidential disaster declarations of 1975 and 1976.

SECTION 2. ADMINISTRATION.) The division of disaster emergency services is hereby authorized to reimburse the federal government (the president's disaster fund) for the state's share of the individual and family grant programs.

SECTION 3. REPORTS.) The division of disaster emergency services will prepare a complete financial report of the individual and family grant program. The report will be presented to the legislative council budget committees and department of accounts and purchases. All unencumbered funds will be transferred to the general fund when the reimbursement is completed.

TURKEY LOSS INDEMNIFICATION

P. Price in the amount of \$1,048.54, plus interest at nine percent, for his claim for relief of loss of turkeys and other property due to activities of the North Dakota national guard. The claim for indemnification shall be submitted to the office of the budget for payment in accordance with chapter 54-14.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.) There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury the sum of \$18,443,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to the state agencies, departments, and institutions listed herein for the construction or addition to, remodeling, and equipping of buildings and facilities within the limitations hereafter stated in this section during the biennium beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979:

SECTION 3. AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS.) The heritage commission may invest amounts received pursuant to the appropriation from the general fund in certificates of deposit in the Bank of North Dakota. Such amounts and interest earned on such amounts shall not become available for construction of the heritage center unless the heritage commission has certified that not less than \$1,500,000.00 in contributions, donations, federal grants, or other sources, not received through appropriations from the state general fund, is available.

SECTION 4.) The appropriations for facilities in this Act are in lieu of appropriations for those facilities, contained in chapter 23 of the 1975 Session Laws of the state of North Dakota, for which funds for their construction would have been transferred to the state capitol construction fund on July 1, 1977, and July 1, 1978.

SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION.) In addition to the other appropriations and authorizations in this Act, there is hereby appropriated any federal, private, or other funds, that may be available, to North Dakota state university for the purpose of constructing a music building during the biennium beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979. SECTION 6.) The state hospital and the health department are hereby authorized to conduct a study of the feasibility of entering into a joint project with Stutsman County and the city of Jamestown for the construction of a security unit to be used by the state hospital, Stutsman County, and the city of Jamestown. The funds herein appropriated to the state hospital for the state share of construction costs of a maximum security unit may be expended together with funds from other sources for constructing a maximum security unit for use of the state hospital.

There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$10,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to the governor for the purpose of procuring the extinguishment of coal vein fires ignited by prairie fires during the fall of 1976 in western North Dakota for the biennium beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979. It is the intent of the legislative assembly that the money provided by this Act be used to extinguish coal vein fires on public and private land, and that it be used to finance only the balance of the cost where the federal government finances the major part of the extinguishment effort.

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY.) This Act is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall be in effect from and after its passage and approval.

There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys not otherwise appropriated, derived from gifts, grants, contracts, sales, services, and other income from the university of North Dakota medical center rehabilitation hospital, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to pay the general expenses, operation, maintenance, and equipment for the biennium beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979, as follows:

Any additional income not required by law to be deposited in the operating fund in the state treasury and income from increased enrollments is hereby appropriated. All income resulting from increased enrollments in excess of estimated income in the budget appropriated by the legislature to the institutions of higher learning must be deposited in their operating funds in the state treasury and can be expended only by authorization of the emergency commission.

SECTION 2. INTENT, REPEAL, PURPOSE, AND CONSTRUCTION.) All Acts and parts of Acts that may be in conflict herewith are hereby repealed and if for any reason or cause any specific appropriation for any item or set of items should be held by the court or courts to be unconstitutional or illegal or otherwise unavailable for any cause, such holdings shall not affect or be construed to apply to the remaining items of appropriation herein or purposes herein.

SECTION 3.) The board of higher education is hereby authorized to use operating funds in addition to appropriated plant improvement funds for the maintenance, repair, and improvement of buildings and land acquisition at the various institutions, with consent of the emergency commission during the biennium beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979.

SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT.) The forty-fifth legislative assembly hereby expresses its intent that residency programs developed and established in North Dakota in support of the 2-1-1 or any other medical education plan implemented by the state board of higher education or the university of North Dakota medical school be financed in conjunction with the private sector. The legislature considers the private sector as including, but not being limited to,

area health education centers, private clinics and hospitals, federal health care facilities, grants, individual physicians and surgeons, and other health care and allied health care institutions.

SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT.) It is the intent of the legislative assembly that the colleges and universities pay special assessments from their plant improvement moneys. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 40-23-22, no funds shall be expended to pay special assessments on projects that do not directly serve a state institution and are not located on or contiguous to a state institution, wherever located in the state.

SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT.) The legislative assembly recognizes the need for flexibility in coordination of the use of appropriated funds and nonappropriated funds for the development of the medical school; however, it is the intent of the legislative assembly that any proposed departure from the priorities established for development of the medical school residency program be approved by the budget section of the legislative council prior to implementation.

SECTION 7. APPROPRIATION.) Any federal funds which can be used for the purpose of providing equal opportunities in programs as mandated by Title IX that may become available to the institutions of higher education under the control of the board of higher education during the biennium beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979, are hereby appropriated.

SECTION 8. BOARD OF HIGHER EDUCATION - BOND ISSUANCE -PURPOSES.) The state board of higher education is hereby authorized to issue and sell in accordance with chapter 15-55, self-liquidating, tax-exempt bonds in an amount not to exceed five hundred fifty thousand dollars for the purpose of renovating and remodeling pioneer hall at Minot state college, Minot, North Dakota. Bonds issued under the provisions of this Act shall not become a general obligation of the state of North Dakota.

SECTION 9. APPROPRIATION - USE OF PROCEEDS.) The proceeds resulting from the sale of bonds authorized in section 8, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated for renovating and remodeling pioneer hall at Minot state college as authorized in section 8. Any unexpended balances from the sale of bonds shall be placed in a sinking fund for the retirement of the bonds authorized in section 8.

SECTION 10. LEGISLATIVE INTENT.) It is the intent of the legislative assembly that if the department of vocational education has funds available to fund the admission counselor II position at the state school of forestry on a fifty percent ratio basis with the state, upon receiving such funds from the department of vocational education, the state school of forestry shall return to the general fund fifty percent of the general fund appropriation

included in its budget to fund the admission counselor's position.

SECTION 11. LEGISLATIVE INTENT.) The forty-fifth legislative assembly hereby expresses its intent that the board of higher education take such actions and direct expenditures to coordinate and correlate the work in the different institutions under its control and direction to prevent wasteful duplication and to develop cooperation among the institutions in the exchange of instructors and students as required by subsection 9 of section 15-10-17 of the North Dakota Century Code. The board of higher education shall prepare a report which sets forth the method and procedure by which unnecessary duplication within the colleges and universities under the board's control will be eliminated. This report shall be submitted to the forty-sixth legislative assembly.

SECTION 12. LEGISLATIVE INTENT.) It is the intent of the legislative assembly that the board of higher education study and determine whether the number of educational institutions under its control and direction exceeds the needs of higher education in this state. It is the intent of the legislative assembly that the board of higher education prepare a report which sets forth their findings and submit the report to the forty-sixth legislative assembly.

SECTION 13. APPROPRIATION.) There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$6,242,080.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to the state board of higher education for the purpose of installing power plant emission control systems at the university of North Dakota, North Dakota state university, North Dakota state school of science, and Valley City state college during the biennium beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979.

EXTENSION DIVISION AND EXPERIMENT STATIONS

AN ACT making an appropriation for defraying expenses of the extension division and the experiment stations of the North Dakota state university of agriculture and applied science.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.) There is hereby appropriated the sums hereafter specified, derived from income and such additional appropriated funds as specified out of the general fund in the state treasury to defray the expenses of the extension division and the experiment stations of the North Dakota state university of agriculture and applied science for the purposes provided by law for the biennium beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979.

Any additional income including funds from the federal government and gifts and donations from private sources received by the North Dakota main experiment station, branch stations, and the cooperative extension division, except as otherwise provided by law, are hereby appropriated for the purpose designated in the gift, grant, or donation; however, public moneys from local sources, which shall include receipts from sale of grains, personal services, dairy products, livestock, and other agricultural products at the North Dakota main experiment station, branch experiment stations, and cooperative extension division, may be expended in excess of that specifically appropriated through biennial appropriations bills of the legislative assembly only in the event that an authorization has first been received from the subcommittee on budget of the legislative council. The balances of all existing moneys on deposit in the name of the North Dakota state university main experiment station, the branch experiment stations, and the cooperative extension division, except grants, gifts, and donations from private sources, along with all subsequent receipts of such moneys, shall be deposited in a special fund in the state treasury. Hereafter, this fund shall be referred to as an operating fund and shall also be the depository for transfers from the general fund, and balances therein shall not revert to any other fund under the terms of section 54-44.1-11. All of the moneys in the operating fund shall remain in such fund until expended pursuant to a specific legislative appropriation or an authorization from the subcommittee on budget of the legislative council, and the balances of such moneys except those received from the federal government or as gifts from private sources, shall be used to reduce the amount of moneys to be expended pursuant to the general fund appropriation only to the extent that the encumbered balance in the operating fund on June 30, 1977, exceeds the estimated income for the biennium ending June 30, 1979. The state board of higher education is authorized to approve transfer of funds between categories of expenditures, and will notify the director of the department of accounts and purchases of any such transfers within ten days following such authorization.

SECTION 2. INTENT, REPEAL, PURPOSE, AND CONSTRUCTION.) All Acts and parts of Acts that may be in conflict herewith are hereby repealed and if for any reason or cause any specific appropriation for any item or set of items should be held by the court or courts to be unconstitutional or illegal or otherwise unavailable for any cause, such holdings shall not affect or be construed to apply to the remaining items of appropriation herein or purposes herein.

SECTION 3. PLANT IMPROVEMENTS.) Minor structures for agricultural research may be authorized for construction by the state board of higher education when such structures do not exceed \$20,000.00 in cost.

SECTION 4. INTENT.) It is the intent of the legislative assembly that \$40,000.00 of the appropriation to the extension division in section 1 of this Act for a resource agent be derived from moneys deposited in such fund as may be designated by the legislative assembly to provide grants to impacted areas affected by coal development.

SECTION 5. INTENT.) It is the intent of the legislative assembly that \$481,966.00 of the appropriation to the main experiment station in section 1 of this Act for coal reclamation research be derived from moneys deposited in such fund as may be designated by the legislative assembly to provide grants to impacted areas affected by coal development.

SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - INTENT - RESOURCES RESEARCH COMMITTEE - DATA - REPORTS.)

- There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the legislative council, the sum of \$2,000,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, and such other public and private funds as may be available and deposited in the special coal research fund for the continued development and operation of the North Dakota regional environmental assessment program. Section 54-44.1-11 shall not apply to the appropriation provided by this section.
- It is the intent of the legislative assembly that 2. priority shall be given to studies in regard to North Dakota's resources and development of the necessary information and analytical systems. These studies shall be for the purpose of assisting in the development of new laws, policies, and governmental actions, and providing facts and information to the citizens of the state in any use and development of resources. The studies, and resulting systems, shall be designed to aid the citizens of this state, officials of the executive branch of government and local government, and the legislative assembly, in knowing the results and impacts of any use or development of resources, to assure that there shall not be material detrimental deterioration of the environment or quality of life in North Dakota, but that any such use shall enhance the quality of life of the citizens of this state.
- 3. The legislative council shall appoint a committee known as the resources research committee consisting of members of the legislative assembly, officials of the executive branch of government as approved by the governor, a representative from each of North Dakota's universities, and if it shall determine it to be beneficial, one or more representatives of the

citizens of the state. The committee in accordance with the laws, rules, and procedures of the legislative council shall be charged with the development and implementation of the program necessary to carry out this section. The committee shall have the authority to prescribe rules of procedure applicable to the regional environmental assessment program. The regular staff of the legislative council shall assist the committee in the same manner as other committees of the council, and the committee may procure such additional staff and technical assistance as may be necessary.

- 4. Data obtained by the regional environmental assessment program from other governmental agencies which is not normally made public or, if it is made public, is not made public in the form the regional environmental assessment program will be using it, shall be subject to the source agency's policy on dissemination of the information consistent with state and federal laws.
- 5. All state departments, agencies, institutions, and local governments shall provide such aid, information, and assistance as the committee may deem necessary. The committee, through the legislative council, shall make periodic reports to the legislative assembly, the governor, and the citizens of the state.

SECTION 5. TRANSFERS.) All net income from charges and fees to private sources for services provided by the North Dakota regional environmental assessment program shall be placed in the special trust fund from the coal severance tax, until the sum of \$2,000,000 has been placed in such fund from such charges and fees. Income from charges for materials supplied by the regional environmental assessment program to all sources, and income from services and materials provided to governmental agencies, shall be placed in the special coal research fund. The emergency commission shall have the authority to approve transfers of funds between the regional environmental assessment program and state agencies as may be necessary to support agencyprogram contracts where agencies cooperate and assist in providing and obtaining necessary data and analyses.

SECTION 6. TRANSFERS.) The director of accounts and purchases and the state treasurer shall make such transfers of funds between lined items of appropriation for the legislative council as may be requested by the chairman of such council upon a finding by such chairman that the nature of studies and duties assigned to the council requires such transfers in properly carrying on the council's functions and duties. The director of accounts and purchases and the state treasurer shall similarly make transfers of funds between the lined items for the forty-fifth and forty-sixth legislative assemblies, upon request of the chairman of the legislative council upon a finding by him that such transfers are required for the legislative assembly to carry on its functions and duties.

SECTION 7. EMERGENCY.) This measure is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.) The moneys herein appropriated in accordance with budget categories for salaries and wages pertaining to workload change, different services, or added facilities shall be made available only after certification to the executive office of the budget that such changes, services, or facilities have been added, or that newly anticipated employees are actually in the employ of the state.

SECTION 3. WEATHER MODIFICATION STUDY.) The legislative council is hereby directed to carry out a comprehensive review and evaluation of weather modification and related activities in North Dakota. The legislative council may request necessary information and assistance from the weather modification board and other interested governmental agencies. SECTION 5.) A new chapter to title 65 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby created and enacted to read as follows:

"CIVIL AIR PATROL MEMBER" DEFINED.) "Civil air patrol member" means a volunteer civilian member of the department of civil air patrol engaged in official state activities authorized under chapter 54-45.

CIVIL AIR PATROL MEMBERS DECLARED EMPLOYEES - COVERED BY WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION.) Civil air patrol members shall be deemed employees of the department of civil air patrol and eligible for coverage under title 65 when engaged in official state activities authorized under chapter 54-45.

COMPENSATION BENEFITS - HOW DETERMINED.) The basis for compensation and benefits for civil air patrol members under this Act shall be determined under section 65-05-09, except that the claimant's weekly wage shall be determined through computation of income derived from the claimant's business or employment.

STATE REIMBURSEMENT FOR LIABILITY IN EXCESS OF COLLECTED PREMIUMS.) Whenever claim liability against the fund credited to the classification of civil air patrol members exceeds the amount of premiums paid into such fund, such excess liabilities shall be a general obligation of the state of North Dakota and shall be reimbursed to the workmen's compensation bureau for credit to that fund through legislative appropriation.

SECTION 6. INTENT, REPEAL, PURPOSE, AND CONSTRUCTION.) All Acts and parts of Acts that may be in conflict herewith are hereby repealed and if for any reason or cause any specific appropriation or any item or set of items should be held by the court or courts to be unconstitutional or illegal or otherwise unavailable for any cause, such holding shall not affect or be construed to apply to the remaining items of appropriation herein or purposes provided for herein.

SECTION 7. EMERGENCY.) Subdivision 2 of this Act is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

There is hereby appropriated to the state health department out of any unappropriated funds in the general fund in the state treasury the sum of \$2,380,905.00 and such additional funds as may become available from federal or other sources to the centers referred to in this section, or so much thereof as may be necessary for the purpose of providing financial assistance in establishing and maintaining during the biennium beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979, the mental health and retardation units, including the south central mental health center, and human service centers created in accordance with law. At the end of the first year of the 1977-1979 biennium, any funds allocated for that year but not spent by each unit or center shall be reallocated by the division of mental health and retardation of the state health department for the second year of the biennium according to distribution formulas developed for the allocation of such funds, except that funds allocated to human service centers shall not be reallocated to mental health centers if such funds are requested by the human service centers. The reallocation after the first year shall be made only upon approval of such allocation by the budget section of the legislative council.

The division of mental health and retardation of the state health department, the mental health and retardation centers, and the central personnel division shall determine the changes that would take place in salary levels of center employees should such centers be included under the supervision of the central personnel division.

The division of mental health and retardation in cooperation with the central personnel division shall prepare a report for presentation to the forty-sixth legislative assembly indicating the effect that bringing such centers under the supervision of the central personnel division would have and contain such information as may be necessary for the legislative assembly to bring such centers under the supervision of the central personnel division.

The sums hereinafter named only, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of the general fund and from special funds derived from federal funds and/or other income in the state treasury to the various departments and various divisions thereof of the state of North Dakota for the biennium beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979, for defraying expenses of the various departments and various divisions thereof of the state of North Dakota for purposes provided by law.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.) The moneys herein appropriated in accordance with budget categories for salaries and wages pertaining to workload change, different services, or added facilities shall be made available only after certification to the executive office of the budget that such changes, services, or facilities have been added, or that newly anticipated employees are actually in the employ of the state.

SECTION 3. INTENT, REPEAL, PURPOSE, AND CONSTRUCTION.) All Acts and parts of Acts that may be in conflict herewith are hereby repealed and if for any reason or cause any specific appropriation for any item or set of items should be held by the court or courts to be unconstitutional or illegal or otherwise unavailable for any cause, such holding shall not affect or be construed to apply to the remaining items of appropriation herein or purposes provided for herein.

SENATE BILL NO. 2015 (Committee on Appropriations)

TRANSFER OF MOTOR VEHICLE FUEL TAX

AN ACT to transfer a portion of the motor vehicle fuel tax revenues to the general fund to cover the cost of administering the motor fuel tax laws.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. TRANSFER.) There is hereby transferred to the general fund in the state treasury out of the motor vehicle fuel taxes, collected pursuant to section 57-54-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, the sum of four hundred seventy-five thousand dollars for the purpose of reimbursing the general fund for expenses incurred in the collection of the motor vehicle fuels and special fuels taxes and the administration of the respective tax Acts.

SENATE BILL NO. 2092 (Wenstrom, Lips, Jones, Solberg, Miller)

JUNIOR COLLEGE EMERGENCY AID

AN ACT providing an appropriation to the board of higher education for state aid to junior colleges; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.) There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$570,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to the board of higher education for the purpose of making state aid payments to junior colleges for the biennium beginning July 1, 1975, and ending June 30, 1977.

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY.) This Act is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall be in effect from and after its passage and approval.

SENATE BILL NO. 2280 (Shablow, Vosper)

STATE ABM COORDINATOR

AN ACT making an appropriation to defray the expenses of continuing the position of state ABM coordinator; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.) There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$29,840.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to the governor's office for the purpose of defraying the expenses of continuing the position of state ABM coordinator for a period of twelve months beginning February 1, 1977, and ending January 31, 1978, as follows:

SENATE BILL NO. 2338 (Nething)

MEDICALLY NEEDY CHILDREN PROGRAM

AN ACT making an appropriation to the North Dakota social service board for defraying the expenses of a program for medically needy children.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.) There is hereby appropriated to the social service board, from moneys not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,421,888.00 in federal funds, \$192,071.00 in county funds, and \$1,190,000.00 from the general fund in the state treasury, or so much thereof as may be necessary, during the period begin-ning October 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979, for providing necessary medical assistance to those medically needy persons under age eighteen who, under rules and regulations promulgated by the board, qualify for and require services such as hospital care, physician services, laboratory and x-ray services, and prescription drugs, on the basis of insufficient family income and resources, but who do not qualify as dependent children under the state's plan for aid to families with dependent children. A report on the implementation and operation of the program funded hereunder shall be prepared by the social service board and presented to the interim committee on budget not later than October 1, 1978. Costs of administering the program shall not exceed 2.7 percent of the funds appropriated under this Act.

SECTION 2. SUSPENSION OF CONFLICTING PROVISIONS -ALTERNATE EFFECTIVE DATE.) In the event the social service board working in conjunction with the governor, the congressional delegation, and the leadership of the North Dakota legislature is unable to secure prior to October 1, 1977, an amendment to or favorable interpretation of Title XIX of the Social Security Act which would permit federal financial participation in the provision of assistance under this Act:

 Any provision of this Act in conflict with Title XIX of the Social Security Act providing federal financial participation shall be suspended and noneffective so as to enable the state to qualify for such participation pending the convening of the next legislative assembly; and

 The operation of the program referred to in subsection 1 may commence on July 1, 1978, or such earlier date as funding may allow as determined by the social service board.

It is the intent of the legislature that congressional action be sought which will permit federal financial participation within the scope of the program established pursuant to this Act, both as to age and available services, to the end that federal enactments allow flexibility to the individual states permitting the duly elected decision makers of a state to decide what is best for the state and its residents.

SENATE BILL NO. 2460 (Maher)

RURAL FOREST AND FIRE PROTECTION PROGRAM

AN ACT making an appropriation to defray the expenses of the rural forest and fire protection program.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.) The sums hereinafter named, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the state forester out of the general fund and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income in the state treasury available to the state forest service during the biennium beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979, for defraying expenses of the rural forest and fire protection program:

SECTION 2. INTENT.) No part of the general fund transfer provided in section 1 of this Act shall be used for any nonreimbursable expenditure.

SENATE BILL NO. 2548 (Committee on Delayed Bills) (At the request of Senator Freed)

SOUTHWEST NORTH DAKOTA WATER SUPPLEMENTATION STUDY

- AN ACT making an appropriation to the North Dakota state water commission for the purpose of the investigation and development of a plan and estimate of costs for the supplementation of the water resources of Dickinson and southwestern North Dakota with water from the Missouri River.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

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SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.) There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$100,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to the state water commission for the biennium beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE.) The moneys herein appropriated shall be used by the state water commission for a study to develop a plan and estimate of costs for supplementation of the water resources of Dickinson and the area south and west of the Missouri River with water supplies from the Missouri River, and for purposes including, but not limited to: domestic, rural water districts, municipal, livestock, irrigation, light industrial, mining, recreational, fish and wildlife, and pollution abatement uses which will result in the best use of such waters and related land resources with primary emphasis on domestic, rural water district, and municipal uses. The plan shall utilize a pipeline 'delivery system.

SECTION 3. MATCHING FUNDS.) The state water commission may use all or any part of any of the moneys herein appropriated to match any federal funds available for such purposes.

SENATE BILL NO. 2549 (Committee on Delayed Bills) (At the request of Senator Melland)

FEDERAL REVENUE SHARING FOR FOUNDATION PROGRAM

AN ACT appropriating federal revenue sharing funds for foundation program payments.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.) There is hereby appropriated to the department of public instruction, from moneys not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$11,000,000.00 of federal revenue sharing funds, or such greater amounts of such funds as may be available, during the period beginning July 1, 1977, and ending June 30, 1979, for the purpose of utilizing revenue sharing funds in the elementary and secondary education foundation aid program as provided for in House Bill No. 1026 and for which the appropriation is provided in Senate Bill No. 2005 of the forty-fifth legislative assembly.

SECTION 2. LEGISLATIVE INTENT.) It is the intent of the legislative assembly that the moneys appropriated in this section be reflected as estimated income in Senate Bill No. 2005 of the forty-fifth legislative assembly.
