Mr. Chairman and members of the Committee, my name is Deb McDaniel, Director of the Charitable Gaming Division with the Office of Attorney General. I was invited here to give you a brief presentation regarding the oversight of charitable raffles.

An organization recognized as a public-spirited organization by the governing body of a city or county may apply for a local permit to conduct certain games of chance when a primary prize does not exceed six thousand dollars and total prizes of all games do not exceed twelve thousand dollars per year. If an organization intends to conduct games of chance that exceed the local permit requirements, an eligible organization as defined by N.D.C.C. § 53-06.1-01, may submit application to the Office of Attorney General, to become a licensed charitable gaming organization. Licensed charitable gaming organizations may conduct games of chance as authorized by Article XI of the State Constitution and must comply with N.D.C.C. 53-06.1. Organizations authorized to conduct a raffle under chapter 20.1-04 or 20.1-08 are not regulated by the Office of Attorney General.

Licensed charitable gaming organizations are randomly selected for audit by this office to verify that the amounts reported on required quarterly returns coincide with the actual conduct of the games and to verify that net proceeds if issued went to eligible uses. In regards to charitable gaming raffle conduct, per N.D.A.C. § 99-01.3-05, licensed organizations are required to retain specific accounting records for three years from the end of the quarter in which the activity was reported.

- Samples of those records are:
  - A purchase invoice documenting the purchase of tickets and the range of ticket numbers printed.
  - Ticket distribution log containing a ticket seller's name, quantity issued, range of ticket numbers issued to the seller, and quantity sold.
  - Reconciliation for the cash received from each ticket seller based on the number of tickets sold, date cash is received, and a schedule of bank deposits.
  - The stubs of all sold raffle tickets and all unsold raffle tickets.
  - A prize register and record of win
  - A summary of gross proceeds, prizes, adjusted gross proceeds, cash profit, cash long or short, and bank deposit. The summaries of all raffles for a quarter must reconcile to the tax return.

If a licensed organization is not compliant with the games of chance laws or rules the Attorney General has the authority to suspend, deny, or revoke an organization's permit or an organizations application or license.

I have for you a copy of the prescribed gaming tax return form and local permit report along with my written testimony for each committee member for their review.
