- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-21-02.4 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to career and technical education scholarship eligibility requirements; and to
- 3 provide an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-21-02.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7 15.1-21-02.4. North Dakota career and technical education scholarship. (Repealed 8 effective July 31, 2024)

- Any resident student who graduates from a high school during or after the 2010-11
 school year and any resident student who completes a program of home education
 supervised in accordance with chapter 15.1-23 during or after the 2012-13 school year
 is eligible to receive a North Dakota career and technical education scholarship
 provided the student:
- 14 a. Completed four units of English language arts from a sequence that includes
 15 literature, composition, and speech;
- 16 b. Completed three units of mathematics, including:
- 17 (1) One unit of algebra II, <u>integrated mathematics II, or integrated</u>
 18 <u>mathematics III,</u> as defined by the superintendent of public instruction; and
 - (2) Two units of any other mathematics, which may include one unit of computer science;
- 21 c. Completed three units of science, consisting of:
- 22 (1) (a) One unit of biology;

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- (b) One unit of chemistry; and
- 24 (c) One unit of physics; or
