



Other Sections in House Bill No. 1002

Supreme Court justices' salaries - Section 3 provides the statutory changes to increase Supreme Court justices' salaries by 2 percent each year of the biennium. Supreme Court justices' annual salaries are increased from the current level of \$157,009 to \$160,149 effective July 1, 2019, and \$163,352 effective July 1, 2020. The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court is entitled to receive an additional \$4,598 per annum effective July 1, 2019, and an additional \$4,690 per annum effective July 1, 2020, an increase from the current additional amount for the Chief Justice of \$4,508 per annum.

Temporary court of appeals - Sections 4 through 12 extend authority for the temporary court of appeals through January 1, 2024.

District judges' salaries - Section 13 provides the statutory changes to increase district court judges' salaries by 2 percent each year of the biennium. District court judges' annual salaries are increased from the current level of \$143,869 to \$146,746 effective July 1, 2019, and \$149,681 effective July 1, 2020. A presiding judge of a judicial district is entitled to receive an additional \$4,240 per annum effective July 1, 2019, and an additional \$4,324 per annum effective July 1, 2020, an increase from the current additional amount for presiding judges of \$4,156 per annum.

Additional appropriation - Section 14 appropriates to the judicial branch all funds received pursuant to federal acts and private gifts, grants, and donations, for the purpose as designated in the federal acts or private gifts, grants, and donations, for the period beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

Line item transfers - Section 15 requires the Director of the Office of Management and Budget to transfer appropriation authority between line items for the judicial branch of government as requested by the Supreme Court upon a finding by the court that the nature of the duties of the court and its staff requires the transfers to carry on properly the functions of the judicial branch of government.

Continuing Appropriations

Restitution collection assistance fund - North Dakota Century Code Section 12.1-32-08 - This fund is used for defraying expenses incident to the collection of restitution through imposing a fee equal to the greater of \$10 or 25 percent of the amount of restitution ordered, not to exceed \$1,000.

Court facilities improvement and maintenance fund - Sections 27-05.2-08 and 29-26-22 - Funding from this fund may be used by the Court Facilities Improvement Advisory Committee to make grants to counties to provide funds for court facilities and improvement and maintenance projects. The source of these funds is a \$100 fee charged in all criminal cases except infractions. The first \$750,000 collected is used for indigent defense services, the next \$460,000 is used for court facilities, and additional collections are deposited equally into the two funds.

Court receivables fund - Section 27-05.2-04 - Any money received by the clerk which is not required to be deposited in the general fund, a different special fund, or the county treasury, and which is received as bail or restitution, or otherwise received pursuant to an order of the court is deposited in this fund. Amounts are used for refunding bail, forwarding restitution amounts to entitled recipients, or otherwise making payments as directed by the court.

Significant Audit Findings

There are no significant audit findings for the judicial branch.

Major Related Legislation

House Bill No. 1015 - Provides for a pretrial services program, including the placement of pretrial services officers in three judicial districts.

House Bill No. 1039 - Increases the age of culpability of a juvenile from 7 to 10 years.

House Bill No. 1068 - Repeals Sections 27-04-01, 27-04-03, 27-04-04, 27-04-06, 27-04-07, and 27-04-08 relating to the Supreme Court reporter.

House Bill No. 1334 - Provides for the sealing of criminal records relating to driving under the influence after 7 years.

House Bill No. 1395 - Requires parental capacity evaluations for individuals convicted of child abuse.

House Bill No. 1516 - Increases the amount of fee revenue placed in the civil legal services fund from \$650,000 to \$750,000 per biennium.

Senate Bill No. 2087 - Reduces the record retention period for adult and juvenile case files and court records from 50 to 25 years.





SIXTY-SEVENTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time funding items approved by the sixty-fifth legislative assembly for the 2017-19 biennium and the 2019-21 one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act:

The 2019-21 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the 2021-23 biennium. The supreme court shall report to the appropriations committees of the sixty-seventh legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. There are appropriated any funds received by the supreme court, district courts, and judicial conduct commission and disciplinary board, not

otherwise appropriated, pursuant to federal acts and private gifts, grants, and donations for the purpose as designated in the federal acts or private gifts, grants, and donations for the period beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

SECTION 4. TRANSFERS. The director of the office of management and budget and the state treasurer shall make such transfer of funds between line items of appropriation for the judicial branch of government as may be requested by the supreme court upon a finding by the court that the nature of the duties of the court and its staff requires the transfers to carry on properly the functions of the judicial branch of government.

SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 27-02-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

27-02-02. Salaries of justices of supreme court. The annual salary of each justice of the supreme court is one hundred ~~fifty-two~~sixty thousand ~~four~~one hundred ~~thirty-six~~forty-nine dollars through June 30, ~~2016~~2020, and one hundred ~~fifty-seven~~sixty-three thousand ~~nine~~three hundred ~~fifty-two~~ dollars thereafter. The chief justice of the supreme court is entitled to receive an additional four thousand ~~three~~five hundred ~~seventy-seven~~ninety-eight dollars per annum through June 30, ~~2016~~2020, and four thousand ~~five~~six hundred ~~eight~~ninety dollars per annum thereafter.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 27-05-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

27-05-03. Salaries and expenses of district judges. The annual salary of each district judge is one hundred ~~thirty-nine~~forty-six thousand ~~six~~seven hundred ~~seventy-nine~~forty-six dollars through June 30, ~~2016~~2020, and one hundred ~~forty-three~~forty-nine thousand ~~eight~~six hundred ~~sixty-nine~~eighty-one dollars thereafter. Each district judge is entitled to travel expenses, including mileage and subsistence while engaged in the discharge of official duties outside the city in which the judge's chambers are located. The salary and expenses are payable monthly in the manner provided by law. A presiding judge of a judicial district is entitled to receive an additional four thousand ~~thirty-five~~two hundred forty dollars per annum through June 30, ~~2016~~2020, and four thousand ~~one~~three hundred ~~fifty-six~~twenty-four dollars thereafter.
