<u>REP BOUCHER</u>: This bill will require an ID of each sexual offender be placed on their drivers license. The bill came out of the criminal justice committee and was very controversial. The intent is to alert law enforcement that the person before him is an offender. It is true that this is an intrusion on some of our rights, but we also have an obligation to protect those who might be victims.

<u>TIM DAWSON</u>: (LC) This will require the ID stay on the license for 10 years after the first conviction and for a lifetime after a subsequent conviction. The ID will be a "Y" on the license. JONATHAN BYERS: (AG) Presented written testimony, which is attached.

<u>DEBBRA HILL</u>: I am for this bill. My 14 year old daughter was attacked by a man who had been convicted of a sex offense in Minnesota and who was not registered in North Dakota. # HOUSE BILL 1031 TESTIMONY HOUSE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE JANUARY 11TH, 1999 PRAIRIE ROOM

Chairman DeKrey, Members of the Committee:

My name is Jonathan Byers and I appear on behalf of the Attorney General. I wish to make a few comments that are neither for nor against House Bill 1031.

In a criminal justice committee hearing during the interim, I happened to mention that Delaware had passed a law requiring a mark to be placed on the driver's licenses of convicted sex offenders. Several law enforcement officers had commented to me that it would be helpful to know when stopping a motorist whether he was a registered offender or not.

The Attorney General is responsible for maintaining the lists of convicted and registered sex offenders in North Dakota. In administering that program, we try to provide the information in the manner that is most helpful to police officers and the public.

By the time this legislation takes effect, should it be passed by the 56<sup>th</sup> Legislative Assembly, we should be capable of electronically providing the information to state radio or law enforcement dispatchers without the need for an actual mark to be on the driver's license. However, this assumes that a state radio check is called in for every traffic stop.

Peace officers are in the best position to know what tools will help them do their jobs. The Attorney General will provide the information to them in whatever manner this Legislature deems appropriate.

# **TESTIMONY FOR HB 1031**

Chairman DeKrey and members of the House Judiciary Committee for the record I am Representative Merle Boucher from District 9, which is all of Rolette County.

House Bill 1031 would require that an individual convicted of felony offense as defined in Chapter 12.1-32-15 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the sentencing of sexual offenders and individuals who commit a crime against a child. This bill would require that individuals convicted of a felony under this chapter of the law would be required to have on their driver's license an identification symbol, the letter "Y".

There was considerable debate during the interim in regards to this concept. This bill has not been debated without controversy. I am asking that the House Judiciary Committee give this bill an objective and thorough hearing. I wish you godspeed and that wisdom prevails.
