### HOUSE BILL 1032 TESTIMONY HOUSE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE JANUARY 11TH, 1999 PRAIRIE ROOM

Chairman DeKrey, Members of the Committee:

My name is Jonathan Byers and I appear on behalf of the Attorney General. I wish to testify in favor of House Bill 1031 and to make a suggestion.

In the adult offender registration program, the term "offenders against children" is defined as an adult who commits certain non-sexual crimes against children under the age of eighteen. It makes sense to register these offenders, because an offender who kidnaps or physically abuses children may constitute a risk to the public.

The 1997 Legislature created a database of juvenile sex offenders and offenders against children. But because the offender as well as the victim is less than eighteen years old, those crimes that are "offenses against children" can be less threatening to the public than inclusion in the database would seem to indicate.

For instance, two sixteen year olds who get into a fight on a Friday night may both be charged with the delinquent act of simple assault. What happened may justify juvenile court intervention, but it doesn't seem to warrant inclusion in the database for up to 10 years, and the resulting disclosure to schools, police agencies, and the department of human services. House Bill 1032 will still require a report to be sent to the Attorney General; however, the Attorney General would not make any disclosure of the information unless the juvenile commits a second simple assault.

Of the 110 juveniles currently reported to the Attorney General, 41 have committed the crime of simple assault. The time and resources of staff would be better spent focusing on the 23 juveniles who have committed sexual crimes.

The Attorney General would prefer that N.D.C.C. section 12.1-17-01 be removed from the list of offenses requiring reporting to the database.
