

Minutes: CHAIRMAN KREBSBACH called the Government and Veteran's Affairs Committee to order. The clerk called the roll. At this time CHAIRMAN KREBSBACH opened the hearing on HB 1044 which is a bill relating to corrections of twentieth century statutory references.

Appearing before the committee to explain the bill was Vonette Richter, Staff Council for the interim Judiciary Committee. This bill in effect was recommended to correct the Y2K problem that will occur in the century code at the end of this year. The bill corrects references to the twentieth century in various forms that are cited throughout the code by over striking the 19 and the blank on various forms and replaces this with _____, _____ so that at the end of 2000 we don't need to do it again. In addition wherever there was the opportunity we cleaned up the antiquated language and things like that. The bill is fairly lengthy and has 42 sections, however, they all essentially do the same thing. There were no questions from the committee.
