HB 1098 Testimony for House Agriculture Committee January 7, 1999

Good morning Mr. Chairman and members of the House Agriculture Committee. I'm Sheila Peterson, the Director of the Fiscal Management Division of the Office of Management and Budget.

For the last 25 years, OMB has been sending funds to every county extension agent to use to pay premiums to kids who exhibit and win prizes at their county achievement days. (1973 - \$300; 1983 - \$500).

OMB would like to continue to do that - but with a lot less paper. Right now, every county agent first has to send us a letter requesting the funds. Then, they have to send us a follow up report on how it was spent.

Our preference, and I think their's as well, is for us to simply send each county \$500 in July of each fiscal year. And if for some reason they don't need the full \$500, they return the unused portion.

The county agents maintain the records at their level for auditing purposes on how the money was spent. We don't believe a duplicate set of records needs to be maintained by OMB.

We approached the extension service to ask their thoughts on streamlining this process and obtained their approval to submit this bill.

We hope you can also support it and give it a Do Pass Recommendation. I'd be happy to answer any questions.
