<u>Summary of the Bill</u>: Relating to filing of notice of revocation of notary commission and prohibited acts of notary public.

#### Testimony in Favor:

Mr. Al Jaeger, Secretary of State, testified in favor of the bill. He submitted a written testimony which he read in it's entirety (**please refer to his testimony**).

Representative Klein, How many notaries are there in ND?

Jaeger, 11,000. They are commissioned for 6 years.

Representative Klein, Page 2, line 1. What does the word jurat mean for us nonlegals? Jaeger, An acknowledgment.

Representative Cleary, When a person is do to apply, would they have to do a new form or

reapply?

Jaeger, The notary needs to know that the person that is signing their name is in fact that person.

They would just cross out the first signature and re-sign their name again. The notary is a

commissioned officer of the state. We haven't had a lot of notaries who haven't witnessed the

actual signature.

Representative Klemin, I had two lawsuits in my private practice in which the notary was

brought in because they had notarized documents that they had not witnessed the signature. They

turned out to be forgeries and then the notary was brought into the party of the law suit. They

were legal documents as part of the lawsuit.

Jaeger, In a case like that, if we were made aware of it, we would have taken appropriate action.

Representative Thoreson, What is the appropriate action?

Jaeger, I have the option of a fine or to revoke the notary. Suspensions can range from 30 days to

6 months. We judge each case differently (leeway).

Representative Haas, How do you get to be a notary?

Jaeger, You come up to our office, fill out the forms and pay us your bond. Basically you apply.

Testimony in Opposition: None.

While other references were removed when that role was removed by the action of a previous legislative session many years ago, these twelve words have managed to remain even though they are not applicable anymore. The intent of this section is to remedy that long overdue oversight.

The two changes in Section 2 are intended to clarify prohibited notary acts and are the result of notary violations that have been reviewed by the Secretary of State's office during the past several years. These clarifications will make it easier to impose sanctions or, if necessary, revoke a notary's commission.

The first change on page 1, line 18 makes it very clear that a notary public must witness the signature of a person prior to his or her notarizing the document.
