Minutes: <u>Kevin Cramer</u>: Director of ND Dept. of ED&F, introduced bill 1141 relating to the structure and duties of the Dept. of Economic Development and Finance. There are three changes, the first relating to the structure of the department. This removes a division of science and technology. The second has to do with our reporting to an interim committee. This focuses on the loan performance. We want to make this more comprehensive with reporting. The third section repeals the requirement to print a manufacturers directory. There are a number of private sector companies who a manufacturers directory. We feel that it would be more appropriate that we let them do this rather than the public sector compete with them. The cost would be more effective to us.

<u>Vice Chairman Kempenich</u>: Are you still going to continue doing performance based reporting?

<u>Kevin Cramer</u>: Yes we are, this language just eliminates some of the things that are eliminated in the first section. This is more conducive to what the division really does.

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Rep. Glassheim: In section two, comparing the dollars spent to jobs created and others, are you

going to continue to do this?

Kevin Cramer: Yes we will continue to do that. The easiest thing for an economic developer to

do is to go out and create jobs. We call this "ribbon cutting syndrome". What is more difficult is

to prove to their investors that that investment has good returns.

Rep. Thorpe: In section three, the repeal of Century Code, what are you doing there?

Kevin Cramer: We are required to print the manufacturers directory. We don't want to have that

responsibility largely because people always do it in the private sector and that is how they earn

their money. We will continue to maintain a data base. It will be much better because we will not

have to print a large volume of them, and can keep it up dated better and be able to supply it to

those people who ask for it. There are people who print directories already. We are trying to

work within our new structure to help companies in the state to better coordinate their needs and

their products with each other.

Chairman Berg: I think the original idea was that the engineers and architects would be designing

our products into their specs, so that when products are bid in ND they would be made in ND.

Kevin Cramer: Yes, that was the original idea. Unfortunately they weren't the users of the

directory. However, the concept is still very important to our service providers and product

managers.

Chairman Berg: Closed the hearing.
