TESTIMONY ON HB 1173 by Curt Zimmerman, Director January 15, 1999

Good morning, Mr. Chairman, and members of the Government and Veterans Affairs subcommittee.

My name is Curt Zimmerman and I am the Director of the Facility Management Division of OMB. HB 1173 relates to the operations of Facility Management's central mailing bureau and is introduced at the request of the Office of Management and Budget.

Section 1 of HB 1173 relates to section 48-06-04 of the 1997 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code. Currently, North Dakota Century Code limits the number of staff that Facility Management may employ in the mail room to a mailing clerk and an assistant mailing clerk. We believe it would be more appropriate for Facility Management to administratively determine the amount of staff required in the mail room based on workload rather than limitations in statute. Therefore, this bill changes the language from "employ a mailing clerk and an assistant mailing clerk" to "employ the necessary mailing bureau staff".

The second section addresses the requirement of requesting permission from the Director of the Office of Management and Budget to obtain postage meters. Presently all state agencies, departments and institutions must request permission to obtain postage meters. The institutions under the control of the Board of Higher Education, because of their locations and knowledge of their operations, should determine their own needs for additional or replacement postage meters. We are also requesting the second line in this section be deleted as it refers to all state agencies, departments and institutions being required to apply for authorization by July 1, 1975.
