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#### Minutes:

The chair called the committee to order with the following present: Chairman R. Kelsch, Vice-Chair Drovdal, Rep Brandenburg, Rep Brusegaard, Rep. Haas, Rep. Johnson, Rep. Nelson, Rep. Nottestad, Rep. L. Thoreson, Rep. Grumbo, Rep. Hanson, Rep. Lundgren, Rep. Mueller, Rep. Nowatzki, Rep. Solberg.

<u>Chairman R. Kelsch</u>: Open the hearing on HB 1191. Clerk read the title.

Rep Hoffner: Is a bill requiring the state department of public instruction to gather information on local, state and federal travel expenditures of the school board, the superintendent and all other school personnel. Why is the bill here. Dealing with other school personnel, especially teachers. The teachers should be at the top of the list for travel dollars.

Rep. Grumbo: The types of jobs the teachers are doing and now you tell us there is not that type of education or in-service available.

<u>Hoffner:</u> A lot of the schools are working hard to bringing in-service to the teachers. There are

times when you have to travel to other citites and other states to get in-service.

Rep. Solberg: Is there anyway to use the Internet to update.

<u>Hoffner:</u> I believe there is. We need to look beyond.

Rep. Nelson: Data is collected and go to the DPI, would they administrate how local districts

decide the travel allotment?

<u>Hoffner</u>: This bill only collects the data.

Rep. Nelson: The current policy is the data is collected internally. You want to take the local

control away from the school districts and centrally locate it within the Department of Public

Instruction.

Hoffner: No.

Rep. Haas: All in-service requires travel?

Hoffner: No.

Rep. Haas: Great deal of in-service training where teachers do not have to travel, how would a

summary of travel expenditures would give you the amount of in-service that is delivered.

Hoffner: Those expenses can be a part of it.

Rep Brusegaard: Change of administrator, shouldn't a school board should make their own

decision as to where travel dollars are spent. New adminisrator may need more help then teachers

at that point.

Hoffner: I agree, but the same goes for new teachers.

Rep. L. Thoreson: Is this directed toward any sized district?

Hoffner: This would be state wide.

Rep. Mueller: Should this bill pass, the data be studied, the concern would be, the mandate

would be to spend more money on teacher travel, and we do that at the expense of in-service.

Are we putting the emphasis on training or travel.

<u>Hoffner:</u> The school district would still be able to spend their travel dollars as they wish.

Rep. Mueller: Concern is the gauge we use to determine may not in all cases be travel expenses.

<u>Hoffner</u>: School districts could do a great amount of in-service training. The result may be that we leave it along.

<u>Vice-Chair Drovdal</u>: Where are we going with this? Do we require this kind of bookkeeping with other other expenses?

Hoffner: Yes.

Rep. Haas: If the expenditures for teachers on in-service were to increase, would in-service take place during the school year? Is it more important to schedule in-service that are outside of the school day, or to have teachers out of the class room away from the students. Isn't the priority to have teachers with their students?

<u>Hoffner:</u> I agree.

<u>Vice-Chair Drovdal</u>: Focus of the bill is on in-service for teachers, why are we including school board?

<u>Hoffner:</u> Get the information, but not get too complicated. Just the three catagories.

<u>Chairman R. Kelsch</u>: Any one else wishing to testify in support of HB 1191? Anyone wishing to testify in opposition of HB 1191?

Ron Torgerson: I represent the North Dakota Council of Education Leaders. This bill is not needed. The reporting mechanizim is already there. Is there a fiscal note attached?

Richard Ott: WIth the North Dakota School Board Association. The information is available at the district level. Every dollar spent must go before the board and be approved by the school board. There is a public review of these records as there records are open to the public.

Rep. Nowatzki: Is there any information as to the percentage of school district travel expentitures that goes to the teacher for in-service training?

Ott: I'm not aware of any?

Rep. Nowatzki: Do you have an estimate?

Ott: No.

<u>Chairman R. Kelsch:</u> Any further questions? Anyone else that wishes to appear in opposition of HB 1191? Seeing none we will CLOSE THE HEARING ON hb 1191.
