Minutes: CHAIRMAN KREBSBACH opened the hearing on HB 1208. Appearing before the committee was REPRESENTATIVE JERRY SVEEN, president of the International Peace Gardens. He indicated that presently the biennial appropriation for the International Peace Gardens is \$365,000. from the State of North Dakota. We have a budget for the biennium for about three to three and one-half million. It's a line item under the state's historical society. The historical society has no control over the peace gardens it is just a pass through vehicle for their appropriations. The check comes to them and they send it to us. Although the state historical society did not object to using them as the vehicle of passage we have the feeling that they were worried that the IPG line would equate to the legislators as a part of their budget, making it more difficult for them to seek additional funding. Mr. Prachl from the dept. of parks and recreation doesn't seem to worry about this. And it seems to make more sense, is more appropriate that we fit into parks and rec. It would be the same relationship as with the state historical society,

# ADDENDUM TO AGREEMENT GENERAL UNDERSTANDING OF ROLES AND RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN INTERNATIONAL PEACE GARDEN, INC. AND

## NORTH DAKOTA PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT

Both parties have established a relationship through legislative language and Memorandum of Understanding. Those instruments establish the legal relationship and enable the allocation of North Dakota general fund dollars towards operations of the International Peace Garden.

For management purposes, a more defined role for each entity is outlined to clarify the relationship to establish lines of communication.

#### **ROLES AND RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN PARTIES:**

## NORTH DAKOTA PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT

- Allocate operation grant to Peace Garden per contract stipulation.
- Generally provide technical assistance on park operation and management issues as requested through director or field manager.
- Provide seasonal employee training at Lake Metigoshe State Park as coordinated through department field manager.
- Share park operation techniques with superintendent and provide the opportunity for superintendent to attend field meetings.
- Share equipment from Lake Metigoshe State Park as available and as scheduled through field manager.
- Attend scheduled board meetings held at the Peace Garden.
- Promote the Peace Garden at major state park sites.

#### INTERNATIONAL PEACE GARDEN

- Promote the state park system at the Peace Gardens.
- Share marketing information with department and co-op with purchases of similar souvenirs as requested by department.
- Coordinate with Lake Metigoshe State Park on training issues and general operation assistance of mutual benefit.
- Share equipment, as available, with Lake Metigoshe State Park and other sites as approved by superintendent.
