Chairman R. Kelsch : We will call the House committee on Education to order and open the  
hearing on HB 1225. We will ask the clerk to read the title.

Rep Aarsvold: District 20. sponsor of HB 1225. This bill is an equity issue to the tuition  
distribution bases on census. We do have the open enrollment law. When I first proposed this, I  
proposed it on an ADM basis, another way would be one half census and one half ADM.

Vice-Chair Drovdal : Asked questions about how equity would balance in a number of  
situations?

Rep Aarsvold: As of now, we grant the sending school district the authority to negotiate with the district that is educating the kids out of state. I don't think it would preclude those situations.

Vice-Chair Drovdal : They wouldn't receive tuition apportion payments because they are going out of state because they wouldn't be part of the ADM?

Rep Aarsvold. Correct.

Rep. Hanson : This is a statement. I differ with you, In Jamestown we provide services.

Rep Aarsvold. It is my understanding that the school district may request the foundation aid portion of the state distribution for the services that the school provides.

Rep. Hanson :How about bus service?

Rep Aarsvold: Bus service, ridership does account in the formula. Then ridership distribution is made back to the district.

Rep. Hanson : We wouldn't have to pick those students up?

Rep Aarsvold: That is a legal issue, and I wouldn't have that information. I believe the court says that you must do so if requested.

Rep. Nelson : In districts where students are choosing private education, or home schools, where that public school is getting the tuition apportion payment,now, they would get fifty per cent with the passage of this bill.

Rep Aarsvold: Correct.

Rep. Nelson : Would the other fifty percent go back into the pool and then be distributed based on the number of students?

Rep Aarsvold: Correct.

1. Please estimate the fiscal impact (in dollar amounts) of the above measure for state general or special funds, counties, cities, and school districts.

**Narrative:**

This bill changes the distribution basis for the state tuition fund from a census basis to a 50% census/50% ADM basis. The appropriation request in the Executive Recommendation is \$53.5 million.

Census is defined as the count of all students age 6-17 that are residents of the district at the time the census was taken (every odd numbered year in May).

ADM is defined as the same ADM used to distribute special education funds. Since the same funding is distributed under both methods, the bill is revenue neutral.
