Minutes:

<u>REP. BELTER</u> Opened the hearing.

<u>REP. RICK BERG, DIST. 45, FARGO</u>, Introduced the bill as the prime sponsor. This bill is to help assess property values more fairly or more accurately. When assessing commercial properties, it is imperative that you have the income and expenses of that property to determine what the net income is , to determine what the taxable value of that property should be. One of the problems in Fargo is, there has been a reluctance of owners of property to provide that information, because that information becomes of record, and when that happens, it is like a business divulging the income and expense details of that, and another business could get that information, which would probably be beneficial to their competitors, rather than to them. This bill will simply allow for a process whereby the assessor could gather that information to help give that commercial property a value. Rep. Berg submitted amendments to the bill which pertained to the fact that if someone challenged the information gathered for an assessment of commercial property, those records would no longer be confidential.

<u>REP. WINRICH</u> Asked if the amendments relate to challenges by the owner of the building? <u>REP. BERG</u> Yes, gave an example of how this could happen using the Grand Forks flood. <u>REP. WINRICH</u> What if the owner challenges the assessment not so much on the basis of his income but the fact that his building is not assessed equitably with someone else's, and wants to get the information about the other building in order to show that inequity?

<u>REP. BERG</u> This bill will improve that whole scenerio. It will allow the assessor to say, comparable property, comparable expenses, comparable rent, are valued at so much. Two commercial properties in the same city could have totally different values because of expenses and income. Hopefully, this will lend to some real numbers for evaluation.

<u>BEN HUSHKA, CITY ASSESSOR, FARGO</u>, Testified in support of the bill. He stated they do have a hard time getting that information. When they ask for that information from property owners, they get a response rate from ten percent to twenty percent of the owners. Most formal appeals filed are based on the fact that the assessor didn't consider the income of the property. This information is more than just rent and expenses. Some of that information could give an owner a competitive edge over another property.

<u>CONNIE SPRYNCZYNATYK, CITY COMMISSIONER, BISMARCK</u>, Testified in support of the bill. She stated her concern is the decision they have to make at the other end . If a business owner has a problem with the value of his property, there is a formal appeal procedure that was mentioned. reason to make an appeal the assessment. We are always stuck with information of the property at that point in the process. This bill could help city council make a decision.

<u>CONNIE STROMBERG, CITY ASSESSOR, WAHPETON</u>, Testified in support of the bill. She stated, that North Dakotans are a private, conservative people by nature, and the smaller the town, the more private the people. This bill could help in getting enough information to do a formal, uniform market.

<u>REP. FROELICH</u> Wanted to know if the amendment solves the problem of confidentiality.

DONNITA WALD, LEGAL COUNCIL, STATE TAX DEPARTMENT, Answered, stating the first part of the amendment takes away any problem that there might have been with the bill regarding confidentiality.

With no further testimony, the hearing was closed.
