If this bill becomes law there will be no top limit, the only requirement would be that there be a minimum of five.

Minutes: CHAIRMAN KREBSBACH opened the hearing on HB 1284 which relates to political party district executive committee membership. Appearing before the committee to introduce this legislation was Representative Andy Maragos, District 3, Minot who is one of the primary sponsors of the bill. He indicated that for the sake of efficiency he wanted the committee to know that this is a good bill, however, he will allow others who can explain the bill better than he can to further elaborate on it. Appearing next was former representative WILLIAM KRETSCHMAR who appeared as an individual and not representing any group. Mr. Kretschmar indicated that this bill has been needed for a long time. What this bill does, in the statute on organization of political parties, there is a limit as to the number of people who are on the, that can be on the district committee, the executive committee. Current statute says between 5 and 18. The bill would remove that maximum number and just say that it is 5 or more who serve on the executive committee. It would give more flexibility to our district organizations.

He indicated this would be a good change in our statute and he was hopeful that this committee and the entire senate will approve this and it will become law eventually. CHAIRMAN KREBSBACH asked if he has heard from district chairman in regard to this issue at all. He indicated that other than his own, none. SENATOR KILZER asked what the penalty is if you do have more than 18 members? Mr. Kretschmar indicated that he didn't believe there is any penalty in the statute. There was no further testimony offered in support of, in neutral position on, or opposition to HB 1284. The hearing was closed on HB 1284. SENATOR W. STENEHJEM made a motion to amend HB 1284 removing lines 4-6 on page 2 of the bill, seconded by SENATOR DEMERS. ROLL CALL VOTE indicated 7 Yeas, 0 Nays, 0 Absent or Not Voting. A motion for DO PASS AS AMENDED was made by SENATOR STENEHJEM, seconded by SENATOR DEMERS. ROLL CALL VOTE indicated 7 Yeas, 0 Nays, 0 Absent or Not Voting. SENATOR STENEHJEM will carry the bill.
