Presently there are 14,562 women who would be eligible to have the office call paid, as provided by this bill. Assuming half would take this option (4,368) and the average cost is \$55, the total increase is \$240,240 per year. This provision would become effective for the PERS plan in 2001.

Sponsor: Representatives Sandvig, Rose, Kliniske; Senators DeMers, Lee, Thane

Affected Retirement Program: Uniform group insurance program

Proposal: Provides that the Public Employees Retirement System Board shall provide medical benefits coverage for annual physical examinations for women.

Actuarial Analysis: The actuarial consultant reported that based upon the assumption that an annual physical examination means an office call, the estimated annual cost of the proposal would be \$240,000.

Committee Report: Unfavorable recommendation.
