<u>REP. BELTER</u> Opened the hearing.

<u>REP. ELIOT GLASSHEIM, GRAND FORKS</u>, Testified in support of the bill. He introduced the bill at the request of the housing authority in Grand Forks who have been in contact with other housing authorities around the state. The request is simply to add housing authorities who are owed debts from people not paying, to the list of agencies which can intercept tax returns if money is owed.

JIM WEIGEL, INDIVIDUAL INCOME TAX SUPERVISOR, STATE TAX

COMMISSIONER, Testified in a neutral position. See written testimony.

<u>REP. WINRICH</u> Asked whether the sponsors of the bill were aware of the Tax Department's concerns?

JILL WEIGEL Stated they were in contact with one of the housing authorities, Grand Forks,

We have been in contact with them quite a bit this past year. Some of these housing authorities are not computerized, there is some thought that they could centralize, but there is no real assurance that will happen.

<u>REP. WINRICH</u> I was more concerned with, have you communicated with the sponsors of the bill, are they aware of these concerns of yours?

JILL WEIGEL Not with Rep. Glassheim.

<u>REP. GROSZ</u> What is the total offset program, how many dollars does it recover?

<u>JILL WEIGEL</u> Stated, currently, the child support program since 1984 - 1998, in one year, 1998, we offset \$173,550. over the total fifteen year period, that has amounted to 1.1 million dollars of child support and about eleven thousand returns. The student loan program we offset last year, \$13,500 for 156 claims. Unemployment job service program, we offset \$21,000 with 222 claims. IRS, we have offset \$75,000 for 629 claims. It keeps growing each year.

PAT FRICKE, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, ND HOUSING FINANCE AGENCY, Testified in a neutral capacity. He offered amendments and gave an explanation on the fiscal note. The Grand Forks Housing Authority were the primary people behind this bill, and asked that the ND Housing Finance Agency implement this. The amendment corrects the housing finance agency century code reference. The reference used is a reference used for housing finance agencies finance programs, which would not benefit from this legislation. It changes it from 54-17-07.3 to just chapter 54-17. He went on to give a background of what the housing authorities do and claims that are administered, such as damages that are done, and income that is not given correctly.

<u>REP. KROEBER</u> Asked whether this is about people renting from HUD?

<u>PAT FRICKE</u> No, they are not renting from HUD, these are folks renting from private individuals. Their monthly payment is assisted by HUD.

<u>REP. KROEBER</u> You are talking about a lot of individuals that have a claim against them. <u>PAT FRICKE</u> Yes, there is a possiblity of a lot of individuals. We have only 37 claims out of 41 receivables totaling \$22,000, so it is not a large number. That is out of a portfolio of 500 and some units and several years. Grand Forks has a much larger portfolio. I don't have those numbers.

With no further testimony, the hearing was closed.





Sen Urlacher opened the hearing on HB 1307. A BILL RELATING TO CLAIMANT

AGENCIES FOR SETOFF OF INCOME TAX REFUNDS.

Rep. Michelson - Grand Forks Housing Authority to be a clearing house for the other housing Authority, they would receive all \$ and distribute to the 40 agencies.

Julie Love - Minot Housing Authority- There are 37 housing authorities in ND, and they are the ones that would recapture funds that are submitted to them. The \$ we are looking to recoup are from past due rent, damaged property, and fraud from tenants on Housing Assistance. We serve thousands of families across ND, and each agency can accrue dollars in bad debt over a year. This has worked well in Minnesota.

Sen. Stenehjem - Why in Grand Forks the central agency and not the State Agency?

Julie Love - They would and have offered to be the clearing house for the other Authority agencies.

Sen Christmann - What does the Authority Agency do?

Julie Love - Operate 340 housing units for low income families, and we administer the housing assistance program. We contract with the US Housing and Urban Development so the funding flows to us and then we lease the rental for families who get subsidized.

Sen Christmann - Where does Minot Housing Authority get money for 340 homes? Julie Love - For instance, in Minot, 220 are elderly and disabled persons that live there. We have 40 scattered units throughout the community. It is basically a contract with HUD. Federal Housing Program, that local agencies contract to administer. Housing Authorities are set up under State Law, they have a 5 member board of Directors, to run the Housing Authority Sen. Christmann - Does the money from Federal go to different agencies to build these dwellings? Who owes you money, and how do you collect it now? Julie Love - We work with local collection agencies. This is for unpaid rent and fraud,

unreported income. We attempt to collect it, and work with the local families. A lot from fraud, they have 2 incomes and don't report this.

Sen Christmann - If this bill is passed, what will you do?

Julie Love - We will test it at the local level first. It is easier to use our collection services and our local resources to do it. If we can't collect we run it through the Grand Forks Authority and it would be through the recapture portion and we would be able to access peoples tax returns. Sen Stenehjem - How many houses does Minot own? Page 3 Senate Finance and Taxation Committee Bill/Resolution Number Hb 1307 Hearing Date 3-1-99

Julie Love - 340 houses. We pay a payment in lieu of taxes, which is based on a percentage of rent. That is through the city, in our situation. The payment is 10% of gross rent, less utilities. We make a payment each year. We are serving low income taxes. Our issue is we want to recapture our losses.

Sen. Urlacher - Does HUD control?

Julie Love - Yes.

Sen. Kinnoin - If renter collects assistance through Soc. Services and are in arrears, can you go to the Soc. Services and garnishee their wages?

Julie Love - Miss Weigel, can better answer that. Debt comes from fraud, reporting no income. Jill Weigel - Tax Dept.-The Tax Dept. comes in and helps recoup loses. Not all Authorities handle debt in same way, so that is why Grand Forks graciously took this on. The cost of implementing the program is \$6-7,000.

Sen Christmann - \$ dealing with here would be income tax refunds and if money owed and collected the money paid back to certain order of receivers or who would get it? Jill Weigel - Based on who is 1st in pecking order. Amazingly there is money left over to do this. Warren Hinsz - Housing Finance Agency, The answer would be sheer volume. The assistance we administer is to persons in projects located in various communities across the State. Our volume is in unpaid rent, and damage claims. On fraud, which is the biggest area, goes back to HUD. About \$22,000 unpaid claims. Support the Grand Forks Authority to collect. We settle with HUD quarterly.

Sen. Christmann - Does the fiscal reflect this? Would these people have to be evicted?

Warren Hinsz - This gives us another avenue to collect these dollars, which we may not have access to. If there is a refund, there is a mechanism that is already in place. This would lower costs for this type of housing.

Sen Stenehjem - What if Grand Forks doesn't want to do it, and State Law now says they have to do it.

Julie Love - Grand Forks is willing and very capable to do it. We don't have a problem with one agency being the lead agency.

Mr. Chairman, and Members of the House Finance and Taxation Committee, my name is Jill Weigel. I am the Individual Income Tax Supervisor with the North Dakota Office of State Tax Commissioner. I am here today on behalf of the Tax Commissioner.

Our agency administers the set off of income tax refunds (commonly referred to as the "refund offset program") for claimant agencies provided for in Chapter 57-38.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, which this bill is amending. This has brought excellent results for those agencies currently participating in the refund offset program. We also do refund offsets for the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). All maintenance of computer programs, beyond the initial programming costs to set up an agency, as well as the administrative costs, are funded by our agency. While the Commissioner does not oppose the addition of more agencies, there are three items of concern the Commissioner wishes to point out for the Committee to review.

Multiple housing authorities

The first addresses the language in the bill referring to "a housing authority created under section 23-11-02." This statute provides for any city or county to approve a housing authority. Currently, there are 32 county, 5 city, and 5 tribunal housing authorities. If all of these housing authorities choose to participate in the program, the Commissioner is concerned about the increased workload our agency would be required to handle. For several years, only the child support unit of the Department of Human Services was a claimant agency. In 1995, the Bank of North Dakota's guaranteed student loan program was added to the law. The 1997 legislative session added Job Service North Dakota and the Workers Compensation Bureau. One employee, part-time, currently handles the offsets for the 4 state agencies, as well as the IRS. This legislation has the potential of adding up to 43 agencies to the program which could significantly affect our resources in administering the program. We took steps in 1997 to automate as much of the refund offset program as possible, which enabled us to maintain one employee, part-time, to

administer the program. However, some manual processes are inevitable. To keep the number of participants in the refund offset program manageable, we would like to see one housing authority be a central depository for all the housing authorities in the state.

The format in which the claimant agency's refund offset information is provided

Much of our administration of the Refund Offset Program relies on our computer system to cross-check the returns as they are processed against the lists of debtors identified by each claimant agency. The statute does not require a specific format in which these lists are provided to the Commissioner. Current participants have worked with our agency to provide them electronically. This has not presented much of a problem for the agencies, who are all computerized and have the capability to generate information electronically. This may not be the case with many of the housing authorities. Some, as we have been informed, do not even have a computer. In order to efficiently administer the program, the Commissioner requests that any claimant agency be able to provide and receive the refund offset information in a format the Commissioner prescribes.

Priority of claims

Under Chapter 57-38.3, the child support unit of the Department of Human Services has priority over all claims in setting off any refund. Other claims are ranked by date of certification and the order of receipt from claimant agencies. This means that each year the priority for refund offsets can change, because the order is based on who gets their list to the Commissioner first. This becomes important when multiple claims occur against an individual taxpayer's refund. Currently, the problem of sorting out multiple claims involves only 3 agencies: the Bank of North Dakota, Job Service North Dakota, and the Workers Compensation Bureau. Fortunately, we have not faced the dilemma of receiving all three agencies' lists on the same day, but we are only into the second year with them. We would prefer not to contemplate what could happen with up to 43 agencies vying for the lead position. The likelihood of multiple offsets occurring is greater than one would think. It happened several times last year. The Commissioner would prefer not to have to re-prioritize these agencies every year. This adds to our programming costs to reset the priority each year, requires additional staff time to re-learn the priorities for offsets that cannot be automatically generated, and places us in the awkward position of having to decide whose list was received first, if delivered on the same day. The Commissioner respectfully asks that the Committee give consideration to establishing a set priority for current and new claimant agencies.
