Minutes:

SENATOR FREBORG opened the hearing on HB1349. All senators present.

Testimony in Favor: Representative Hawken introduced HB1349. Rep. Hawken passed out an amendment. It was put in the wrong section. This amendment would put it in the right spot. When the law was put into place for safety patrols, the thought was that they would do an age and they did age 11. What was not taken into consideration at that time was that there are several school districts in the state of ND that have 5th grade as the highest grade in their elementary school. There are some children in those 5th grade classes who have not yet turned 11. So the change in this bill is from an age which was 11 to a grade which is 5. With the advent of middle school it is becoming more of a trend and there are a number of school districts that do have fifth grade as their highest grade. marvelous educational experience for the students who participate. Bev Nielson said to tell you that the ND School Board Association is in favor of the bill.

Testimony in Favor: Tom Decker, DPI. School safety patrols have fallen into our area. We developed a hand book for safety patrols that is currently out there. Vern Bennett from Fargo called and asked if we would help with this change. Many districts have gone to middle schools and need to have safety patrol students out of the fifth grade. The bill is straightforward change and we think it is a good idea.

SENATOR O'CONNELL : On the amendment, have you looked at it? It is just a code change.

Tom: We forgot in the draft of the first bill to put it in the revised code section.

SENATOR REDLIN : I noticed two differences in this amendment. It eliminates legal guardian and says rules instead of standards. Are there reasons for that.

Tom: We no longer have standards, we have rules. Just a matter of English. You would have to ask Anita about the issue of legal guardian. Could be interpretation.

SENATOR WANZEK : Both these sections are current law now aren't they.

Tom: I believe you are correct.

SENATOR FREBORG : Will our intern tells me, that Anita says that when you are a guardian you are considered to be the parent.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL NO. 1349

Pa Pa -Page 1, line 1, after "Code" insert ", or in the alternative to amend and reenact section 15.1-19-11 of the North Dakota Century Code"

Page 1, line 4, replace "Section" with "If House Bill No. 1034 does not become effective, section"

Page 1, after line 14, insert:

"SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-19-11 of the North Dakota Century Code, as created by House Bill No. 1034, as approved by the fifty-sixth legislative assembly, is amended and reenacted as follows:

15.1-19-11. School safety patrols - Establishment - Adoption of rules. The board of a school district or the governing body of a nonpublic school may authorize a school principal or administrator to establish a safety patrol and to appoint students to the safety patrol. Any student age eleven or older enrolled in grade five or higher is eligible for appointment to a safety patrol, provided the student's parent has filed written permission with the school principal or administrator. The superintendent of public instruction shall adopt rules to guide safety patrol members in the conduct of their duties and shall specify the identification to be worn and the signals to be used by safety patrol members while on duty."
