RE: HB 1364 – Articles of Association for a Cooperative

The intent of this bill is to clarify this section of law by making it clear that a cooperative must provide their name and a complete address for its principal office in its articles of association when filed with the Secretary of State's office (this is the same information that is already required of all other business entities).

While this change in the law may appear to be somewhat insignificant, having this information is essential for the proper management of the cooperative's records within the Secretary of State's office.

Although providing this information would seem logical and reasonable to most, the introduction of this bill was prompted by a recent filer's refusal to provide more than the law currently provides. That is, only the name of the city.

Finally, in our continuing review of the bill since its introduction, we identified the need for two amendments that would make the law even clearer. They are attached to this testimony and we respectfully request they become a part of this bill.

RE: HB 1364 – Articles of Association for a Cooperative

The intent of this bill is to clarify the address requirements in subsection 11 of section 10-15-05. The bill makes it clear that a cooperative must provide either the name and complete address of its registered agent or a complete address (not just the city) for its principal office in its articles of association when those documents are filed with the Secretary of State's office.

This is the same information that is already required of all other business entities that are filed with the Secretary of State's office. We believe it is important to have the procedural laws governing the various business entities as uniform as possible.

While this change in the law may appear to be somewhat insignificant, having this information is essential for the proper management of the cooperative's records within the Secretary of State's office. The bill does not change anything regarding those cooperative's records that are already on file.

The purpose of the amendments adopted in the House was to further clarify the address requirements.
