A BILL FOR AN ACT TO AMEND AND REENACT SUBDIVISION D OF SUBSECTOIN 19 OF SECTION 20.1-02-05 OF THE NORTH DAKOTA CENTURY CODE, RELATING TO PUBLICATION OF PUBLIC ACCESS BOOKLETS UNDER THE PRIVATE LAND HABITAT AND ACCESS IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM.

**REPRESENTATIVE GROSZ**: Opened hearing on HB 1411.

REPRESENTATIVE CARLSON: Last session we had a program setup for the sportsmen of the state. There was a private land initiative where they were given the authority to go out and lease land for public access. It is a very successful program but in the bill we called for them to do something that said that they would publish and sell a booklet on an annual basis describing the lands at are open to public access within the state. There was a little confusion of what they were supposed to provide and in the process, they ended up becoming a printer of a book that is normally done in the private sector. We would like them to publish a booklet from their own funds that describes the lands that are open to public access in the state so they are not competing with the private sector. This has to be paid for out of the fund that we have set up out of the habitat money. This needs to be available at any place that you can purchase a license, so that those people can find the public access areas.

**REPRESENTATIVE HENEGAR**: On this particular situation, there is nothing that says that the private individual cannot include that in there if he wants to, is there?

**REPRESENTATIVE CARLSON**: There is nothing that says he cannot include that.

**ROGER ROSALL**: Deputy Director, Game and Fish testifying in support of HB 1411. Fiscal note shows that it cost \$40,000 to print it and made \$40,000 selling it.

**REPRESENTATIVE NELSON**: Do you have any maps left in inventory and if you do, how many?

**ROGER ROSALL**: About 800 left and those will probably be sold out by the end of the biennium.

**REPRESENTATIVE HENEGAR**: How can there be no cost for printing?

**ROGER ROSALL**: This bill does not change the brochure, there continues to be a cost for that, the map book is the cost I am talking about.

**REPRESENTATIVE NELSON**: I had a publisher in my district that was working on a map similar to this, and when the current bill was passed, it was in direct competition to this individual. His costs were considerably higher than what the books were selling for. He was looking in the \$25 - \$30 price range. He could not compete. I am happy to see that this issue can be resolved in a fashion that will not put private industry at direct competition with a state agency.

**ROGER ROSALL**: It appears that two sentences are inverted in the bill. The overstrike should follow the state. It appears that the whole language is inverted.

**REPRESENTATIVE HENEGAR**: You are saying the bill I introduced is not accurate?

**ROGER ROSALL**: The overstrikes should follow at the end. This way it reads that we are supposed to be funding a book, it basically does not say we are going to eliminate the book. The correct wording should be, "Publishing a booklet on an annual basis describing lands that are open to the public access in the state that are funded from the Game and Fish Department Private Land and Habitat Access Improvement Fund." Meaning, we would print that brochure up listing all the lands that are funding from the Habitat Improvement Fund.

**REPRESENTATIVE GALVIN**: How are these brochures distributed?

**ROGER ROSALL**: They are available at all of our district offices and sporting goods stores.

**PAUL KRARY**: Representing the Cass County Wildlife Club. Testifying in support of HB 1411. We urge a Do Pass.

**REPRESENTATIVE GROSZ**: Closed hearing on HB 1411.

SENATOR FISCHER opened the hearing on HB1411: A BILL FOR AN ACT TO AMEND AND REENACT SUBDIVISION d OF SUBSECTION 19 OF SECTION 20.1-02-05 OF THE NORTH DAKOTA CENTURY CODE, RELATING TO PUBLICATION OF PUBLIC ACCESS BOOKLETS UNDER THE PRIVATE LAND HABITAT AND ACCESS IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM.

REP. CARLSON explained HB1411 is for the ND Game and Fish Dept. to produce an annual publication guide for hunters that is free of charge, which includes the areas funded on private lands.

SENATOR FREBORG asked how much land is assigned for hunting.

REP. CARLSON replied there are 60,000 acres open for public access. ASCS offices were contacted and offered a cost share on seed. ND Game and Fish pays ½ of the seed up to \$20 per acre and in turn receive access to the land for the full term of the CRP contract.

SENATOR HEITKAMP asked what is the incentive for the farmer.

REP. CARLSON replied \$20 per acre and we pay ½ of the grass seed up to \$20 per acre.

SENATOR FREBORG asked if all of the land posted by ND Game and Fish Dept.

REP. CARLSON replied yes. Permanent metal signs are marked in each corner of the access land.

ROGER ROSTVET, ND Game and Fish Dept. testified in favor of HB1411.

SENATOR FISCHER closed the hearing on HB1411. SENATOR HEITKAMP moved for a DO PASS, seconded by SENATOR REDLIN. Roll call vote indicated 5 YEAS, 0 NAYS, 1 ABSENT AND NOT VOTING. SENATOR FISCHER volunteered to carry the bill.
