Minutes: CHAIRMAN KREBSBACH called the committee to order and instructed the clerk to call the roll. At this time the hearing was opened on HB 1415 which relates to compensation of members of the legislative assembly; and to provide an effective date. Appearing before the committee was MICK GROSZ, District 8, prime sponsor of the bill. He indicated to the committee that this is a simple bill which gives the majority and minority leaders of both houses an extra \$250.00 compensation year round for the work they do. I think in the last sessions we've expected more of our leaders to actually go out on a statewide basis. As we all know, we get \$250.00 per month to take care of extra expenses that we do for constituent services in the interim. Our leaders, whether they are the majority leader or the minority leader, do constituent services for the state. I thought that it would be a good idea to put in a little extra pay for them to be reimbursed for some of the extra expenses that they get. Questions and comments were offered by SENATORS THANE, KILZER, and CHAIRMAN KREBSBACH. There was no
