<u>Rep. Nelson</u>: In your research, how many times has the new money in the corrections budget exceeded the school funding package?

<u>Boucher</u>: History would show that every session education exceeded corrections. Since 1993 the correction budget in North Dakota increased and now we are proposing another twenty million to that. So the correction budget is growing.

Rep. Nelson: Are we setting a precedence - tying the hands of future assemblies?

Boucher: We aren't tying the hand of future assemblies, we are just putting education first.

<u>Chairman R. Kelsch</u>: What are your projections into the future as to what the increases will be on the increase of correction budget?

Boucher: I think the population of corrections will grow.

<u>Vice-Chair Drovdal</u>: In speaking to corrections - if we educate the child we may not have to spend so much on criminals.

Boucher: You make a good point, view education as a life-long process. My focus is on K-12.

<u>Vice-Chair Drovdal</u>: If you take the flexibility out of the legislature, they may have to make a choice, possibly taking money away from higher education.

Boucher: The bill lays it out very clearly. The priority is k-12 education.

<u>Larry Klundt:</u> represents North Dakota Council of Education Leaders. I checked the neutral column for this bill.

<u>Chairman R. Kelsch:</u> Anyone wishing to speak in support of HB 1438? Anyone wishing to speak in opposition of HB 1438? Hearing none, we will close the hearing on HB 1438.

1999 TESTIMONY HB 1438

TESTIMONY FOR HOUSE BILL 1438 Prepared for Representative Merle Boucher Tuesday - January 26, 1999

Chairman Kelsch and members of the Education Committee, for the record I am Representative Merle Boucher, from District 9, which is all of Rolette County.

Members of the House Education committee, some of you may think that the good representative from District 9 is simply making a statement about his displeasure with the uncontrollable growth that is taking place in the corrections budget. I assure you ladies and gentlemen that my intent is more than a statement. My position is clear and to the point.

I believe that a responsible legislative assembly will invest at a minimum as much new money; qualified new money ... excludes carry over dollars as a part of the increase in educational dollars; as they did in new money appropriations for corrections.

My approach is simple; "it has always been more affective to build children, than as an after thought to try and manage damaged adults." I ask that you give HB 1438 serious thought and consideration.
