TESTIMONY FOR HCR 3019

JANUARY 28, 1999

Good morning Chairman Nicholas and members of the House Agriculture Committee.

The resolution before you today is an attempt to study a problem that has developed over the past few years. With the increase of canola acres across the state to a nearly equal level with sunflowers, the canola producers feel it is time for the Oilseed Council membership to more equally represent the canola producers. At present the Oilseed Council is made up of sunflower producers from designated areas around the state, while canola has one producer presentative appointed by the governor. The canola producers are generating a large number of dollars with their check off. They also have numerous needs and problems, some similar to sunflower and other oil seeds, but some unique as well. The canola producers would like more representatives on the Oilseed Council. I considered a bill to make the various sunflower districts generic oilseed districts. I discovered, however, that this would hurt North Dakota's representation on the National Sunflower Council. This is not our intent. I also do not think a separate Canola Council is necessary or cost effective. I really have no solid solution and want to work with the other oilseed producers to come to a consensus on how to solve the canola problems. Therefore, I would urge you to look favorably upon this resolution and give it your support.
