## STATEMENT BY THE AMERICAN CROP PROTECTION ASSOCIATION BEFORE THE HOUSE COMMITTEE OF AGRICULTURE FIFTY-SIXTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA

#### **FEBRUARY 11, 1999**

#### **CONCERNING HCR3035**

#### LADIES AND GENTLEMEN:

THE AMERICAN CROP PROTECTION ASSOCIATION IS THE NOT-FOR-PROFIT TRADE ASSOCIATION, BASED IN WASHINGTON, D.C., THAT REPRESENTS THE COMPANIES THAT PRODUCE, SELL AND DISTRIBUTE VIRTUALLY ALL OF THE CROP PROTECTION AND PEST CONTROL CHEMICALS REGISTERED FOR USE IN THE UNITED STATES.

ACPA APPRECIATES THE INVITATION OF THIS COMMITTEE TO TESTIFY IN SUPPORT OF THE BILL BEFORE YOU: HCR3035.

#### HARMONIZATION – WHAT AND WHEN?

- UNDER NAFTA, A U.S./CANADA/MEXICO TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP WAS FORMED TO HARMONIZE THE REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS FOR PESTICIDES.
- USEPA AND ITS NORTHERN COUNTERPART, THE CANADIAN PEST MANAGEMENT REGULATORY AGENCY, HAVE BEEN WORKING TO HARMONIZE REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS AND REVIEW PROCESSES FOR PESTICIDES SINCE 1993 THE LAST SIX YEARS. THE TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP GUIDES THIS PROCESS.
- CURRENTLY, USEPA AND PMRA ARE WORKING TOGETHER ON PILOT PROJECTS FOR JOINT REVIEW OF PESTICIDES. A RESULT OF THIS IS ONE NEW PESTICIDE, CYPRODINIL FOR USE ON FRUIT AND NUT CROPS. ADDITIONALLY, USEPA AND PMRA HAVE SHARED DATA ON 80 OTHER PESTICIDE PRODUCTS IN EFFORTS TO ALLOW GREATER EFFICIENCIES IN THE REGULATORY SYSTEMS.

- UNFORTUNATELY, THE PACE TOWARDS HARMONIZATION IS GRADUAL AND SLOW AND NOT NECESSARILY ONE WHICH KEEPS THE TIMING INTERESTS OF GROWERS IN MIND.
- HARMONIZATION IS ALSO A PROCESS WHICH REQUIRES TREMENDOUS RESOURCES AND FOCUS FROM THE US AND CANADIAN REGULATORY AGENCIES, USING PERSONNEL WHO MAY ALSO BE INVOLVED WITH NUMEROUS OTHER ISSUES CONCERNING THE REGULATION OF PESTICIDE PRODUCTS WITHIN THEIR OWN RESPECTIVE COUNTRIES.
- IF PESTICIDE PRODUCT TESTING WERE HARMONIZED, WE STRONGLY BELIEVE A MAJOR STEP TOWARDS ADDRESSING US GROWERS' CONCERNS OVER PRODUCT AVAILABILITY AND PRICE.
- LAST DECEMBER, THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE SIGNED A
  DOCUMENT OF UNDERSTANDING TO EXPLORE HARMONIZATION
  ISSUES OF CONCERN TO GROWERS ACROSS THE COUNTRY. IN MARCH,
  USDA WILL CONVENE A GROUP OF CANADIAN AND U.S. REGULATORY
  OFFICIALS AND SEVERAL CEO'S OF CROP PROTECTION COMPANIES TO
  EXPLORE THE ISSUES OF CONCERN. WE SUGGEST THAT NORTH
  DAKOTA MAY WISH TO OFFICIALLY ATTEND OR MONITOR THESE
  TALKS.

WHILE WE SUPPORT CALLS FOR AN EXPEDITED HARMONIZATION AND ADDING RESOURCES TO THE TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP, WE MUST REMEMBER THAT AVAILABILITY AND COST COULD POTENTIALLY WORSEN BECAUSE OF THE CURRENT UNCLEAR WAY IN WHICH USEPA IS IMPLEMENTING THE FEDERAL FOOD QUALITY PROTECTION ACT OF 1996. (PLEASE SEE ACPA TESTIMONY SUPPORTING HCR3030 REGARDING THIS ISSUE.)
