PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3037

Page 1, line 1, replace "review" with "act on behalf of the American farmer and pursue full, fair, and free trade by using the Export Enhancement Program to open foreign markets to agricultural products and by amending those portions of"

Page 1, line 2, replace "and amend those portions of the agreements" with "which"

Page 1, line 3, remove "that" and replace "repeal" with "by repealing"

Page 1, after line 4, insert:

"WHEREAS, the Export Enhancement Program was initiated under the Food Security Act of 1985 to offset the adverse effects on United States exports due to unfair trade practices or subsidies by competing exporters; and

WHEREAS, since its inception, the Export Enhancement Program has played a major role in exports of many agricultural commodities, particularly wheat, which has accounted for 80 percent of the value of all Export Enhancement Program sales; and

WHEREAS, more than \$5.5 billion was spent on wheat Export Enhancement Program sales between the mid-1980s and the mid-1990s; and

WHEREAS, during the last decade, the Export Enhancement Program has been applied to approximately two-thirds of all United States wheat exports; and

WHEREAS, during the Uruguay Round of the GATT agreement, the United States agreed to reduce the value of expenditures on subsidized exports and to reduce the volume of subsidized expenditures relative to the 1986-90 base; and

WHEREAS, since decisions to reduce the value of expenditures on subsidized exports were made, producers have had to contend with disastrously low commodity prices and funds provided by Congress to promote agricultural exports have gone unspent; and"
