The hospital administrator pointed out some of their concerns in trying to keep open rural hospitals. I had a question on unfamiliar words such as tri-care which covers the military. The concern was how are the hospitals in the rural area being reimbursed from the providers for the services that they do offer at the hospital. Minutes:

The hearing was opened on HCR3046.

REPRESENTATIVE STEFONOWICZ, sponsor, explained the bill. It is a resolution looking into the relationship of rural hospitals and insurers relating to what can keep these rural hospitals viable in our communities. We need to study the challenges to rural hospitals including the concerns relating to reimbursement. One of the primary concerns is what is happening to Medicare reimbursement. They have cut back services in Tioga and this is happening throughout the state. SENATOR DEMERS: Is this focused only on finances and reimbursement. Should we have a broader subject like the increase of the aging population, the need for rural hospitals to combine services. We need to be looking at regionalization. REP STEFONOWICZ answered that he has no problem with broadening it out. There is a need for some kind of assistance.

MURRAY SAGSVEEN, State Health Officer, stated that the Health Council is going to visit with Legislative Council and maybe broader issues will result. SENATOR KILZER: If neither one of resolutions is accepted what will happen? MR. SAGSVEEN: The Health Council plans to move forward in any event.

MICHIM SAX, Watford City, ND, supports bill. The rural hospital at Watford City no longer provides obstetric services. The death of our hospital will probably be the death of our community, along with the death of our school. Declining enrollment, declining population, aging population, lack of resources, no employment are all issues of concern. We are struggling to stay alive.

The hearing was closed on HCR3046.

Discussion resumed on 3/17/99.

SENATOR LEE moved amendments 0101. SENATOR DEMERS seconded it. Roll call vote carried 6-0-0. SENATOR DEMERS moved DO PASS AS AMENDED. SENATOR KILZER seconded. Roll call vote carried 6-0-0. SENATOR FISCHER will carry.
