Testimony of John Dwyer President, Lignite Energy Council HCR 3049 Before the House Finance and Taxation Committee February 15, 1999

HCR 3049, a study resolution introduced by the leadership, is requesting the Legislative Council to <u>continue</u> its competitiveness studies of our state's second largest industry. This is important to the state because as the second paragraph on line 10 states:

> "North Dakota's lignite industry generates over 20,000 direct and indirect jobs for North Dakota, over one billion dollars in annual business volume, and over sixty-five million dollars in annual tax revenue."


As Dr. David Ramsett stated in his report to the Taxation Committee last fall (a copy of which I will provide to each of you) our industry is under increasing competitive pressures. Dr. Ramsett made two specific findings that should be of concern to all of us:

<u>First:</u> "..."Continued price decreases in the delivered price of subbituminous coal to electric power plants in the region are threatening the economic viability of North Dakota's minemouth coal-electric power industry.This means they must consider the possible substitution of western sub-bituminous for lignite coal." ..." <u>Secondly</u>: "..."In many cases, electric power plants using subbituminous coal are now more cost efficient than North Dakota's mine-mouth electric power plants." ..."

But it's not just domestic competitive pressures that jeopardize the future of this abundant, low Btu state resource. As indicated on page 2, line 14, there are also many international impediments to the future development of our lignite resource. The Kyoto Treaty, which was signed by the Administration on November 12th of last year, would decrease our production by about 5 million tons. I repeat - 5 million tons, or 15 percent of our current production. EPA's regional haze proposals and new NO_x standards that fail to recognize the low Btu qualities of lignite are additional burdens that the industry and the state will face. And all of this is being done in spite of the fact that we are a "clean air state" and one of only a handful of states to meet all clean air standards.

Mr. Chairman, you may ask - why study the lignite industry again? In view of the large stake we have in North Dakota's economy, I don't think you can afford not to. The Legislature and the state of North Dakota have been key partners in the development of reasonable fiscal and regulatory policy that governs lignite development. With all the domestic and international threats facing the industry, we think it prudent for the Legislature to continue this partnership and be updated on new developments so it can appropriately respond.

Mr. Chairman, the Lignite Energy Council and its membership support this study. We ask your favorable consideration of HCR 3049.
