Chairman R Kelsch : Open the hearing on HCR 3060.

<u>Rep Boucher:</u> District 9, sponsor of HCR 3060. This would be a study to provide property tax relief and to equalize funding for political subdivisions that do not impose home rule sales tax. End of side A tape #1 -- Begin side B tape #1

This would create a study during the interim to discuss and determine the feasibility that a portion of the state aid and distribution funds money that is turned back to the cities and the counties as a result of the apportionment state wide sales tax, the four tenths of one per cent, that

they would consider an enhancement fund or an equalization fund. A portion would go back to the cities and the counties would go to those cities and counties that don't levy a local sales tax.

Rep Nottestad : How would this work?

<u>Boucher:</u> This resolution has nothing to do with education. It should have gone to taxation. We have seventy plus cities that levy a local sales tax. That puts them at an advantage over all the others that can not or do not levy a local sales tax.

Rep Grumbo : How much money would the counties be getting in a lump sum?

<u>Boucher:</u> It will now generate somewhere seventy to seventy five million, so it looks like there will be an extra twenty million to be divided among the political subdivisions.

Rep Grumbo : Why not broaden the sales tax?

<u>Boucher:</u> As you know the state aid and distribution fund was at point six tenths of one cent and then reduced to point four tenths, but the cap was taken off. If it was taken back to the six tenths then that is where the enhancement money would come from.

<u>Rep Nelson :</u> That is when this issue would be getting into this committee, because sales tax revenue is a major part of how we fund foundation aid and if we increase to six tenths, I don't think it was ever funded at that amount. Aren't we taking money away from increased foundation funds if we increase it to that amount?

Boucher: Described tax concept back in the 1980's.

<u>Rep Nelson :</u> My point, if we would enhance and return the money to the counties, that money is part of the funding that increases education funding.

Boucher: You have to keep in mind, that the money that would flow back to the county and also impact upon the property tax.

Vice Chair Drovdal : Are we sending a mixed message

Boucher: A lot of communities where it is not really practical to do it.

Rep. Nowatzki : Are we rewarding certain political subdivisions for not levying a local tax.

Boucher: We are not rewarding, it is a case where they are unable to do it.

Rep. Nottestad: IF something came out of this, would it be a way of stopping the small

communities from imposing a sales tax?

Boucher: I don't know how much the small communities are collecting, very little I suppose.

Chairman R Kelsch : Anyone wishing to speak in opposition to HCR 3060. Hearing none, we

will close the hearing on HCR 3060.
