<u>REP. BELTER</u> Opened the hearing.

<u>REP. PHILIP MUELLER, DIST. 24</u>, Introduced the resolution. This is a resolution which urges Congress to identify and institute new crop insurance programs which offer enhanced revenue and income protection to our farmers and ranchers here in the state of North Dakota. The resolution asks Congress, specifically, to add hay and grazable grasses to the mix of insured crops and to make all federally sponsored programs affordable and more accessible to our farmers and ranchers. The recent years of devestating crop losses have resulted in a severe economic downtrend for rural communities. The 95 Fair Act did some good things for production ag, but it did not address crop insurance as it promised it would. This resolution is a wakeup call to Congress to do what they promised they would do.

With no further testimony, the hearing was closed.

THANK YOU FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO APPEAR BEFORE YOU TODAY IN REGARD TO HCR 3063

HCR 3063 IS A RESOLUTION THAT URGES CONGRESS TO IDENTIFY AND INSTITUTE NEW CROP INSURANCE PROGRAMS THAT OFFER ENHANCED REVENUE AND INCOME PROTECTION FOR FARMERS AND RANCHERS.

THE RESOLUTION ASKS CONGRESS SPECIFICALLY TO ADD HAY AND GRAZABLE GRASSES TO THE MIX OF INSURED CROPS AND TO MAKE ALL FEDERALLY SPONSORED CROP INSURANCE PROGRAMS AFFORDABLE AND ACCESSIBLE TO THE FARMER AND RANCHER

RECENT YEARS OF DEVASTATING CROP LOSSES HAVE RESULTED IN A SEVERE ECONOMIC DOWNTRUN FOR RURAL COMMUNITIES AND FARM-RANCH FAMILIES. THE SHRINKING PROFIT MARGINS IN AG MAKE CROP INSURANCE THE LAST TRUE SAFETY NET. BUT IT MUST BE AFFORDABLE AND USEABLE IN MORE AREAS OF PRODUCTION AG.

THE '95 FAIR ACT DID SOME GOOD THINGS FOR PRODUCTION AG BUT IT DID NOT ADDRESS CROP INSURANCE AS IT PROMISED IT WOULD. THIS RESOLUTION IS A WAKE-UP CALL TO CONGRESS TO DO WHAT THEY PROMISED TO DO.
