Minutes: CHAIRMAN KREBSBACH opened the hearing on SB 2056. Appearing before the committee to introduce this proposed piece of legislation was SENATOR GARY NELSON, Senate Majority Leader, representing District 22. Senator Nelson is a cosponsor of the bill. He indicated that the bill is a very simple change that will allow a little more flexibility in the meetings between the legislative council and the aboard of higher education. As you can see on line 9, as the bill presently is in the statute it talks about October of 1996. That has caused us just a little bit of problems in trying to have a specific date to find, to put a meeting together. The meetings are extremely important. They've been very valuable to both the council and I think to the board of higher education. The history of it is that it started out simply as the four legislative leaders getting together back in the middle 80's and have progressed to the point where it is a meeting of the full legislative council. It's a chance for us to have an exchange and to have some dialogue that is always beneficial and the changes in this bill just simply give us a little

flexibility as to when it may be scheduled. To be honest with you, we and I don't remember which year it was, we had a conference call for about 5 minutes in October, to meet the letter of the law, and then set the meeting up in November just before the legislative council full hearing. Again, this would facilitate a little better timing on some of those meeting agendas. He indicated that he would be happy to try and answer any questions.

SENATOR KREBSBACH-Are there any questions from the committee?

SENATOR KREBSBACH-Is there any further testimony in support of SB 2056?

LAURA GLATT-Vice Chancellor for Administrative Affairs for the North Dakota University System appeared before the committee to testify in support of SB 2056. A copy of her written testimony is attached.

SENATOR GARY NELSON-One other thing that I should have said. Report means report and while I would intend when I am a member of the legislative council perceive that the council and the board have a physical meeting. It does leave that option for the council just to add the board to give them a report. I think that is equally as effective. Not every year is there a necessity for us to sit down and talk about these things, but it leaves that door open.

SENATOR KREBSBACH-Is there further testimony in support of SB 2056. I see no one else here to be in opposition I don't believe unless it's somebody from the committee, or neutral position, therefore we will close the hearing on SB 2056. At this point a brief review of the days committee hearings was held. No action was taken by the committee on any of the three bills heard today. CHAIRMAN KREBSBACH-Since there is no further discussion the committee will stand adjourned.

#### Madam Chair and Members of the Committee:

I am Laura Glatt, Vice Chancellor for Administrative Affairs for the NDUS. I am here today to support SB2056. This piece of legislation merely updates dates for Board planning and reporting purposes. It would require the Board of Higher Education to report to the Legislative Council and Governor in 2002 on the status of the current goals as outlined in the Board's strategic plan for the period 1998-2004.

In 2003, the Board would be required to present a new comprehensive strategic plan for the period 2004-2010. Every year thereafter, the Board would report to the Governor and Legislature on the status of the implementation of the goals outlined in the plan.

You should also be aware that the Board introduced a bill that to amend NDCC 15-10-14.2. The bill number is 2140. It accomplishes many of the same changes outlined here.
