Minutes:

SB2078 relates to selection of jurors from a judicial district in the event of a natural disaster.

SENATOR WATNE opened the hearing on SB2078 at 11:40 A.M.

All were present.

KEITH NELSON, State Court Administrator, Supreme Court, testified in support of SB2078.

With the Grand Forks flood, they set up a temporary courthouse in Larimore. They did not have access to juries because of the displacement of all the people of the county. Looking at our emergency planning, the Chief Justice's thought was we should address this bill. Justice Newmann thought there should be an amendment to this bill showing that it is in any county, not just those counties addressed in the other bill. Amendments attached.

SENATOR LYSON asked if there was any way to change this so it could be adjoining counties instead of judicial district.

Hearing Date January 13, 1999

KEITH NELSON stated that they most likely would go to the adjoining county.

SENATOR STENEHJEM returned from his meeting.

SENATOR STENEHJEM asked if we could get a copy of a state map with the judicial districts.

KEITH NELSON stated that he would get that to the committee.

JIM GANJE, Supreme Court, testified in support of SB2078. In response to Senator Lyson's response, the Court Administrator is correct that the Supreme Court's interest would be in lessening the costs of jurors should something like this ever happen again. Limiting it to drawing from adjoining counties by law is that if you go to the adjoining county and you still can't get enough jurors, then we are right back to where we started from. With this bill, there will be statutory authorization to go beyond the adjoining counties.

SENATOR STENEHJEM CLOSED the hearing on SB2078.
