Minutes:

Senate Bill 2085 relates to the registration of airmen.

SENATOR B.STENEHJEM called the hearing to order at 9:30 a.m. in the Lewis and Clark

Room. All committee members were present: Sens. B. Stenehjem(Chairman); Schobinger,

Mutch, Cook, O'Connell, Thompson, and Bercier.

SENATOR B. STENEHJEM opened the hearing on SB 2085.

GARY NESS, NORTH DAKOTA AERONAUTICS COMMISSION spoke in favor of SB 2085 (See attached testimony).

SENATOR B. STENEHJEM There is a \$9,300.00 fiscal note. Where will the proceeds go?

<u>GARY NESS</u> The proceeds will go towards publishing materials such as an airport directory and, also, administering the airman's certificate. We realized that it cost \$12.00 to administrate it but we were only receiving \$8.00. spending \$12.00 but only receiving \$8.00. We have identified 4,000 pilots in the state and only 2,700 are registered which includes 200 mechanics.

<u>SEN. B. STENEHJEM</u> What happens if one doesn't pay the fee? Does your license expire and are you required to take another test?

<u>GARY NESS</u> You can be registered with the state by proving that you have a certificate with the Federal Aviation Administration and that you have a medical certificate. You can still be registered with the state if you lose your medical certificate, but you can no longer fly solo. The state registration was used basically for knowing where the pilots were. Now with the Internet we no longer need to keep track of people especially with the expense.

SEN. B. STENEHJEM I still have my federal certificate; if I'm not actively flying, I have no need to update it.

GARY NESS Federal certification is good for life.

SEN. B. STENEHJEM closed the hearing on SB 2085.

THERE WAS DISCUSSION AMONG THE COMMITTEE.

SEN. BERCIER This is just a certification? It does not relate to a pilot's license?

SEN. B. STENEHJEM Indirectly it does? You have to have a federal and state license.

SEN. BERCIER So it only applies to a state license? The license could be applied for at no fee?

SEN. COOK It is my understanding that one may not need a state license but one does need to

register for a federal license and there is a charge for that. It doesn't do much.

SEN. MUTCH I don't see what the difference is. It isn't going to stop you from applying.

<u>SEN. COOK</u> It isn't going to stop you from having it or not having it.

<u>SEN. COOK</u> I move for a Do Pass.

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SEN. MUTCH seconded.

Senate Bill 2085 Before the Senate Transportation Committee January 7, 1999 Testimony of Gary Ness, Executive Director North Dakota Aeronautics Commission

Chairman Stenehjem and members of the Senate Transportation Committee, thank you for the opportunity to appear today before your committee in support of Senate Bill 2085. This bill would repeal Section 2-05-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, which provides:

Every individual who pilots, maintains, and certifies airworthiness of an aircraft or helicopter within this state shall register with the aeronautics commission and shall renew such registration every four years thereafter in which he pilots, maintains, or certifies airworthiness of an aircraft or helicopter within this state. The commission shall charge for any one or more such registrations for each individual or company, and for each four-year renewal thereof, a fee of eight dollars, except that the commission shall charge three dollars for each two-year registration or renewal thereof for student pilots. These fees must be deposited into the aeronautics commission special fund.

The Aeronautics Commission's reason for submitting this bill is as simple as the bill is short: this is an area which is already sufficiently regulated by the federal government. The Commission feels that the additional expense to the aviators and aircraft mechanics of North Dakota is not necessary, and that repealing N.D.C.C. § 2-05-10 will in no way reduce the safety of our airways. Repealing the registration requirement will also allow Commission staff to spend additional time on other statutory duties and efforts to improve flight safety.

I would be happy to answer any questions you may have about the bill.
