Minutes:

SB2087 relates to memberships, meetings, and compensation of the parole board, parole revocation proceedings, and fair treatment standards for victims and witnesses of crimes.

SENATOR STENEHJEM opened the hearing on SB2087 at 10:45 A.M.

All were present.

ERNIE REINERT, Department of Corrections, testified in support of SB2087. Testimony attached. If we could get 6 members, it would help with rotation. These parole board members can revoke parole and can also add time.

SENATOR WATNE asked about the reappointment of members, no prohibition on getting reappointed.

ERNIE REINERT stated that they can be reappointed. Their per dium is \$62.00 a day. SENATOR STENEHJEM asked if this was to be like two parole boards and rotate them. Page 2 Senate Judiciary Committee Bill/Resolution Number SB2087 Hearing Date January 13, 1999

ERNIE REINERT stated this was correct.

SENATOR TRAYNOR asked about a bill that was introduced that changed the dollar figure on theft and the bill is adopted. This is now a felony and not a misdemeanor. This is an issue for the parole board.

ERNIE REINERT stated that yes, this would be taken into consideration.

SENATOR WATNE asked what presumptive parole is.

ERNIE REINERT stated that the parole board uses this as a risk score. They arrive at a parole eligibility date that is based on their risk score. The inmate would have a personal appearance before the board. They review in person the prisoner's case file. They send parole plan to parole officer to the place where the parolee wants to live. Based on this information they decide whether to parole someone.

SENATOR STENEHJEM had to leave the meeting to go to another meeting. He turned the meeting over to Vice Chairman SENATOR WATNE.

SENATOR WATNE CLOSED the hearing on SB2087.

ERNIE REINERT (Pardon Bd.) This bill is intended to save some wear and tear on the Pardon Board members. There are now three members on the board and by adding three more they can each cover one-half of the meetings, cutting down on the time they have to spend in Bismarck or Jamestown. The board meets once a month for nine months and the meetings last for two and a half days. This bill will increase the number of members to six, but only three will meet at any one time. I ask that you add the emergency clause to this bill.

Warren R. Emmer, Director Department of Corrections Field Services Division Testimony in Support of SB 2087

I. Problems facing the current North Dakota Parole Board

- A. Parole board dockets have risen approximately 300% during the last ten years 1.Former boards worked approximately two days every other month 2.Current board works three day per month
- B. Parole Board members are called on to do more with inmate applicants then in previous years
  - 1.Parole to more options
  - 2.Presumptive Parole
- C. Illness and conflicts have reduced Parole Board to a quorum of two (several times)
- D. Questions arise as to when parole violators are entitled to good time
- E. Current law requires victim participation in non-paroling administrative decisions
- II. SB 2087 will rectify the problems outlined in part I.
  - A. Additional parole board members will alleviate excessive work loads by creating two panels
    - 1. The two, three person, panels will work three days every other month
  - 2. Illness and conflicts are easily solved by utilizing other board members
  - B. Legislation clarifies when an inmate receives good time
  - C. Law will allow victim participation when inmate has a personal appearance before the board
