Minutes:

SENATOR TRAYNOR opened the hearing on SB 2091: A BILL FOR AN ACT TO AMEND AND REENACT SECTION 20.1-03-17 OF THE NORTH DAKOTA CENTURY CODE, RELATING TO DISPOSITION OF GAME AND FISH LICENSE PROCEEDS; AND TO PROVIDE A CONTINUING APPROPRIATION.

PAUL SCHADOWALD, Chief Administrator of the Services Division of the ND Game and Fish Department testified that state fees that are collected need to come into the state treasurer and be appropriated out by the Legislature.

SENATOR HEITKAMP asked about the figure of +180,000 on the fiscal note.

PAUL SCHADOWALD stated that Game and Fish will be writing checks for \$180,000 more per biennium than we have been and the +\$180,000 to the Game and Fish will be a minus \$180,000

back to the auditors. There is, by law, an amount set for the county auditor for handling the licenses.

SENATOR HEITKAMP asked if the vendors are allowed to keep a small fee?

PAUL SCHADOWALD stated that the most vendors do not charge, but if they do, it is a very minimal fee.

SENATOR CHRISTMANN asked if the monies are sent to the auditors and not the vendors.

PAUL SCHADOWALD replied that the vendor's fee is optional and is not part of the license fee and does not affect the amount of money the Game and Fish Dept. receives.

SENATOR REDLIN asked if the law specifies a ceiling on what that fee could be.

PAUL SCHADOWALD replied that the law for the vendors specifies the maximum of 50 cents

per license, and a specific amount is set for the license itself.

SENATOR TRAYNOR asked whether the bill would affect the private seller.

PAUL SCHADOWALD stated it is between Game and Fish and county auditors.

SENATOR TRAYNOR closed the hearing and asked if the committee desired to take any action.

Senator Heitkamp moved for a DO PASS. Senator Freborg seconded the motion.

1. Please estimate the fiscal impact (in dollar amounts) of the above measure for state general or special funds, counties, cities, and school districts.

Narrative: Currently County Auditors are shipped hunting and fishing licenses from the Game and Fish Department. The County Auditors sell some of the licenses and appoint agents (retail businesses) to sell licenses. License fees are returned to Game and Fish minus the commission that is set in the ND Century Code. The commissions are retained by the Co. Auditors. A recent ND Supreme Court decision, Billey vs. ND Stockmen's Assn., appears to require that the entire license fee be returned to Game and Fish and be deposited with the State Treasurer. This bill does this. Game and Fish would then send a commission check to the Co. Auditor using a continuing appropriation to do this. Commissions total about \$90,000 per year.
