Minutes:

SENATOR NETHING: Opened the hearing of SB 2111; a BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 4 of section 54-44-11 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a continuing appropriation for the state personnel training and development operating fund.

EILEEN HOLWEGNER: Fiscal Officer for the Fiscal Management Division of OMB, presented testimony in regard to personnel training and the development fund. The training fund has been used as a non-appropriated revolving fund since its inception many years ago; this will change the century code to clarify the practice. (testimony attached) (tape 847-1105)

DAN LEROY: In 1997, central personnel offered 21 different training programs to 2400 people. In 1998, there were 46 different training programs to over 3000 people. The training programs are presented in house or will contract with an outside company to do that. We recently added computer lab as an out source on computer training and are providing 27 different training courses to state agencies. Our price is \$76 per course as compared to \$119 per course. There are many examples noting the success of the program. The funding set up for the training department has been very effective. We currently have a balance of about \$14,000 and during the biennium the money going in and out of there is about \$145,000.

SENATOR NETHING: Do the funds come from the agency that requests the training service?

DAN LEROY: Yes.

SENATOR NETHING: Without this revolving fund you end up short in your appropriation.

DAN LEROY: Without this revolving fund, our training goes down the tubes. The way it is currently set up is very effective for us. We are able to recover our costs. Initially in 1983 it was set up with an appropriation of \$10,000. Currently we have about a \$14,000 fund.

SENATOR GRINDBERG: I was a member of a task force this past summer to improve job training in the state of ND. As a result of that there is legislation coming forward in a couple of different bills this session. The whole effort is to reorganize the ND University System capturing particular areas of expertise for training, but specifically to house the marketing entity with the four 2-year colleges: Wahpeton, BSC, UND-Williston; and Devils Lake. Have you collaborated with BSC on a number of your issues for training? How often do you use BSC for your training needs?

DAN LEROY: We have often worked in collaboration with BSC in trying to set up various training programs.

LINDA JENSEN: Director of Training and Development in Central Personnel. We have contracted with professors through the university system to put on programs at central personnel, We have also offered programs at the universities. I am currently serving on the advisory group you are referring to in getting the work force ready for 2,000 or whatever.

SENATOR NETHING: Called for the motion.

My name is Eileen Holwegner. I am the fiscal officer for the Fiscal Management Division of the Office of Management and Budget. OMB is introducing Senate Bill 2111 to clarify language in section 54-44-11 of the North Dakota Century Code in regard to the state personnel training and development fund. The Central Personnel Division of OMB provides or arranges various training programs for state agencies. The state agencies participating in these programs are charged a fee based on the cost of the programs. Central Personnel deposits these fees in their training fund which is used to pay for the cost of the training programs. The training fund has been used as a non-appropriated revolving fund since its inception many years ago, and this change in century code clarifies this practice.
