North Dakota State Hospital January 12, 1999

Mr. Chairman, members of the Committee, my name is Alex C. Schweitzer and I am the Superintendent of the North Dakota State Hospital. I am here to ask for your support in amending subsection 3 of section 25-02-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the governing body of the state hospital.

The amendment removes reference to the performance improvement coordinator as a mandated member of the hospital's governing body. This position was once a member of the management team at the hospital and had primary responsibility for assuring hospital quality of care activities. Upon the retirement of this individual, management was reorganized and primary responsibility for this function was delegated to the Superintendent and Medical Director. This change was to provide evidence to the Joint Commission on the Accreditation of Hospitals, the accrediting body of the hospital, that senior management was providing primary leadership in this important area of assuring quality of care at the hospital. The day to day functions of this position were delegated to an employee directly reporting to the Superintendent's office. The performance improvement coordinator no longer serves on the board, thus the need to clean up the language in the statute.
