Minutes: CHAIRMAN KREBSBACH called the committee to order and instructed the clerk to call the roll. At this time the hearing was opened on SB 2209 which relates to the date of convening of the organizational session of the legislative assembly. SENATOR GARY NELSON, District 22, prime sponsor of the bill appeared before the committee to introduce the bill. The purpose of this bill is to give some flexibility to legislative management and legislative council in dealing with timelines. This bill will allow for some flexibility as to start time for the legislative session. This would allow for some adjustment to other situations in the state. SENATOR KILZER-Is there any date by which the legislative council should set it? SENATOR NELSON-The date is actually set by the legislative management committee and then it is affirmed by the council at the November Council meeting. Normally we know sometime in June or July.
