Sen Urlacher opened the hearing on 2236, A BILL RELATING TO A SALES AND USE TAX EXEMPTION FOR OFFICE FURNITURE AND COMPUTER TELECOMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT IN A NEW OR EXPANDING PRIMARY SECTOR BUSINESS, AND TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Sen. Kroeplin- Loss of population in rural ND, small towns, and we need to make some changes. It will encourage businesses to locate or expand in a city, of 2500 or less, by exempting office furniture, telecommunications equipment, computer equipment and sales tax.

Sen. Urlacher-any questions? In opposition? Committee will recognize the fiscal note on 2236. Gary Anderson-Tax Dept- Telecommunication, companies, coming into the small community, no exceptions in this bill.

Sen. Stenehjem-Can larger cities provide the exemptions to these companies at this time under home rule?

Gary Anderson-For State Sales tax - No. Can do it in city, that imposes a local sales tax. extend the local tax exemption to include these items.

Sen. Stenehjem - What about property taxes? Can small towns give them exemptions for property taxes?

Gary Anderson - There are incentives, but I am not strong or sure in this area.

Sen. Wardner - At this time if TMI, in Dickinson, they expand and put in equipment, they can get an exemption on sales tax, on the equipment they put in the plant. Is this correct?

Gary Anderson - That is correct, under mfg. exemption, equipment that they use, with this bill the smaller communities would extend that to businesses that we recognize as Manufacturers.

There is a partial exemption on computer equipment. If this is involved in testing or research of materials that they are producing. This bill would provide a limited exemption, to companies within a small community..

Sen. Stenehjem - The fiscal note, apparently looking at \$46,000 left in the Gen. Fund, and \$4,000 in the spec. funds. Where does the \$4,000 come in?

Gary Anderson - That represents the State Aid Distribution portion.

Sen. Urlacher - Any questions or testimony?

Close the hearing on 2236.

REP. BELTER Opened the hearing.

SEN. KEN KROEPLIN, DIST. 23, Introduced the bill as the prime sponsor. There are two bills in and they are virtually the same bills. This bill was here last session. This bill will exempt equipment purchased, from sales tax, for primary sectors, for telecommunications equipment, such as office equipment, whatever it takes to set up an office. Currently, there is an exemption for manufacturing equipment. Submitted population excerpts taken from the North Dakota In Perspective: Its Past and its Future. See attached copy. This would be a unique opportunity for our rural communities.

REP. RENNER Do you recall last session, what the fiscal note was on this bill?

SEN. KROEPLIN No

TODD KRANDA, ATTORNEY FOR THE KELSCH LAW FIRM, Testified in support of the bill. In looking at the bill, on page 2, he felt it needed to be clarified further. Presented amendments to the committee which would identify the definition of telecommunications equipment.

<u>REP. WARNER</u> Most of our towns are under twenty five hundred population, will this bill exempt them?

NO ONE ANSWERED THE QUESTION.

<u>REP. WINRICH</u> I was looking at the definitions also, the definition of primary sector seems rather vague, is that a standard definition in law?

TODD KRANDA Stated he couldn't tell if it appears elsewhere, he didn't review that, the Legislative Council assisted in the drafting of this, they would not have intended to duplicate language, so I assume it is not defined elsewhere.

REP. KROEBER What changes this would make on the fiscal note by the addition of the amendments.

TODD KRANDA Stated he didn't think there would be any changes. We don't intend to impact it other than simply clarifying the telecommunications provision that is already on page 1, line 10. When I looked at the definitions, it seemed like there was something missing, the definition covers wireless, and everything you can think of that would be a telecommunications item. With no further testimony, the hearing was closed.






These graphs show the projected and continuing decline of Rural North Dakota. Do we except the demise of North Dakota or do we take steps to change the obvious...




- 1. Only six counties were able to attract more people into the county then move away between 1990 and 1996
- 2. Eight counties lost more than 10% of their population base through outmigration between 199 and 1996




- 1. 2/3 of the counties in ND are classified as Frontier--they have fewer then 6 residents per sq. mile
- 2. This is due to the concentration of population in ND--rural to urban movement




1. It is estimated that the number of public school districts with High Schools enrolling fewer than 75 students will increase dramatically with 10 to 12 years.



1. In 1996, a significant number of public school districts had High Schools with fewer than 75 students enrolled.



1. The globalization of Internet, Binet, and E-mail use offers an important perspective into the new information age.



- 1. Natural decrease occurs when more people die in a county than are born.
- 2. 58% of the counties in ND have natural decrease.
- 3. In order for a county to gain population, it has to have natural increase that exceeds net-out migration or net in migration that exceed natural decrease, or both net in migration and natural increase.
