Testimony in Favor: Representative Hoffner, District 32. Why do we always have to pass the foundation aid too late in the session. So that is what this bill is all about. This looks at the first year only, so we would determine what that foundation aid payment would be for next year. Early March would be ideal. Determine 1st year payment out so it can be passed right away. If you want to add more it can be readjusted in the 2nd payment. If you want to blend it into another bill that is all right.

## Narrative:

This bill establishes the educational support per student amount at \$2,129.

The Executive Recommendation establishes the educational support per student amount at \$2,129 the first year of the biennium and at \$2,221 the second year. The funding level in the Executive Recommendation is \$475.9 million.

Funding at \$2,129 for both years of the biennium reduces the required funding level to \$465.1 million, or a reduction of \$10.8 million.
